House Resolution

A resolution recognizing Florida's Healthy Start coalitions and designating April 19, 2005, as "Healthy Start Coalitions Day."

6 WHEREAS, there are 32 Healthy Start coalitions throughout 7 the state, each charged with reducing infant mortality, and 8 these coalitions have played a large part in improving Florida's 9 rank in infant mortality, which has dropped from 48th to 33rd in 10 the nation, and

11 WHEREAS, Healthy Start coalitions, comprised of community 12 volunteers who are uniquely positioned to assess and respond to 13 maternal and infant health needs and to direct funding toward 14 services that address those needs, have created a seamless 15 system of care that benefited more than 174,126 moms and babies 16 in Florida in fiscal year 2003-2004, and

WHEREAS, in 2003-2004, Healthy Start coalitions collectively leveraged more than \$21 million, including 11,575 volunteer hours and \$2,615,038 of in-kind services and resources, cash, grants, and projects related to maternal and infant health, and drew down almost \$16.5 million in federal funding, NOW, THEREFORE,
