WHEREAS, with a population of nearly 4 million people, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico boasts an additional 2.7 million Puerto Ricans who live in the continental United States, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of its 1952 Constitution, Puerto Rico is a self-governing commonwealth freely associated with the United States, its chief of state being the President of the United States of America and its head of government being an elected governor, and

WHEREAS, Puerto Rico, whose people enjoy a richly diverse cultural and racial heritage, has one of the most dynamic economies in the Caribbean region, with exports and imports nearly doubling between 1987 and 1997, and the lush climate of the island creates agricultural opportunities for exporting sugarcane, coffee, pineapples, plantains, bananas, and rum, and
