 3 F.S.; redefining the term "robbery" to include the
 4 unlawful endeavoring to take property; providing that if
 5 an offender threatens to use a weapon or firearm during
 6 the course of a robbery, the offender commits a felony of
 7 the first degree; providing penalties; amending ss.
 8 812.131 and 812.133, F.S.; redefining the terms "robbery
 9 by sudden snatching" and "carjacking" to include the
 10 unlawful endeavoring to take property; reenacting ss.
 11 921.0022(3)(f), (g), (h), and (i) and 1006.13(5)(a), F.S.,
 12 relating to the offense severity ranking chart and the
 13 policy of zero tolerance for crime and victimization;
 14 incorporating the amendments to ss. 812.13, 812.131, and
 15 812.133, F.S., in references thereto; providing an
 16 effective date.

 18 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 20 Section 1. Section 812.13, Florida Statutes, is amended to
 21 read:

22 812.13 Robbery.--

23 (1) "Robbery" means the taking of or endeavoring to take
 24 money or other property that ~~which~~ may be the subject of larceny
 25 from the person or custody of another, with intent to either
 26 permanently or temporarily deprive the person or the owner of
 27 the money or other property, when in the course of the taking or
 28 endeavoring to take there is the use of force, violence,

29 assault, or putting in fear.

30 (2)(a) If in the course of committing the robbery the
 31 offender carried a firearm or other deadly weapon, then the
 32 robbery is a felony of the first degree, punishable by
 33 imprisonment for a term of years not exceeding life imprisonment
 34 or as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

35 (b) If in the course of committing the robbery the
 36 offender carried a weapon, or threatened to use a weapon or
 37 firearm, then the robbery is a felony of the first degree,
 38 punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

39 (c) If in the course of committing the robbery the
 40 offender carried no firearm, deadly weapon, or other weapon, or
 41 did not threaten to use any weapon or firearm, then the robbery
 42 is a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s.
 43 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

44 (3)(a) An act shall be deemed "in the course of committing
 45 the robbery" if it occurs in an attempt to commit robbery or in
 46 flight after the attempt or commission.

47 (b) An act shall be deemed "in the course of the taking or
 48 endeavoring to take" if it occurs before ~~either prior to,~~
 49 contemporaneous with, or after ~~subsequent to~~ the taking of or
 50 endeavoring to take the property and if it and the act of taking
 51 or endeavoring to take constitute a continuous series of acts or
 52 events.

53 Section 2. Subsections (1) and (3) of section 812.131,
 54 Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

55 812.131 Robbery by sudden snatching.--

56 (1) "Robbery by sudden snatching" means the taking of or

57 endeavoring to take money or other property from the victim's
 58 person, with intent to permanently or temporarily deprive the
 59 victim or the owner of the money or other property, when, in the
 60 course of the taking or endeavoring to take, the victim was or
 61 became aware of the taking or endeavoring to take. In order to
 62 satisfy this definition, it is not necessary to show that:

63 (a) The offender used any amount of force beyond that
 64 effort necessary to obtain possession of the money or other
 65 property; or

66 (b) There was any resistance offered by the victim to the
 67 offender or that there was injury to the victim's person.

68 (3)(a) An act shall be deemed "in the course of committing
 69 a robbery by sudden snatching" if the act occurs in an attempt
 70 to commit robbery by sudden snatching or in fleeing after the
 71 attempt or commission.

72 (b) An act shall be deemed "in the course of the taking or
 73 endeavoring to take" if the act occurs before ~~prior to~~,
 74 contemporaneous with, or after ~~subsequent to~~ the taking of or
 75 endeavoring to take the property and if the ~~such~~ act and the act
 76 of taking or endeavoring to take constitute a continuous series
 77 of acts or events.

78 Section 3. Subsections (1) and (3) of section 812.133,
 79 Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

80 812.133 Carjacking.--

81 (1) "Carjacking" means the taking of or endeavoring to
 82 take a motor vehicle that ~~which~~ may be the subject of larceny
 83 from the person or custody of another, with intent to either
 84 permanently or temporarily deprive the person or the owner of

85 the motor vehicle, when in the course of the taking or
 86 endeavoring to take there is the use of force, violence,
 87 assault, or putting in fear.

88 (3)(a) An act shall be deemed "in the course of committing
 89 the carjacking" if it occurs in an attempt to commit carjacking
 90 or in flight after the attempt or commission.

91 (b) An act shall be deemed "in the course of the taking or
 92 endeavoring to take" if it occurs before ~~either prior to,~~
 93 contemporaneous with, or after ~~subsequent to~~ the taking of or
 94 endeavoring to take the property and if it and the act of taking
 95 or endeavoring to take constitute a continuous series of acts or
 96 events.

97 Section 4. For the purpose of incorporating the amendments
 98 to sections 812.13, 812.131, and 812.133, Florida Statutes, in
 99 references thereto, paragraphs (f), (g), (h), and (i) of
 100 subsection (3) of section 921.0022, Florida Statutes, are
