Subsection (5) of section 474.203, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 14 474.203 Exemptions. -- This chapter shall not apply to: 15 16 (5) Any person, or the person's regular employee, or 17 an independent contractor under the supervision of such person 18 who is administering to the ills or injuries of her or his own animals, including, but not limited to, castration, spaying, 19 and dehorning of herd animals, unless title has been 20 21 transferred or employment provided for the purpose of 22 circumventing this law. An independent contractor may not 23 advertise in any way that implies that he or she is a veterinarian. In the advertising, it must also contain a 2.4 statement that he or she is not a veterinarian and has no 25 26 veterinary medical training. In addition, a horse owner may 27 engage a farrier to provide routine hoof maintenance, equine 2.8 dental technicians to provide routine hand floating of teeth, and other persons to provide hands-on healing, homeopathy, 29 nutritional counseling, and any other therapies not considered 30 to be the practice of veterinary medicine by the board. Eliminates a definition for the term "animal."
