HB 981 2005

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to job opportunities for youths; providing legislative intent to support vocational training and placement provided to at-risk youths through the Professional Opportunities Program for Students; providing for a pilot program; requiring program proposals to be submitted to the Department of Juvenile Justice; requiring a report to the Legislature; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Professional Opportunities Program for Students; legislative intent; pilot program.--

(1) It is the intent of the Legislature to provide support and funding for programs conducted by the Professional Opportunities Program for Students, hereinafter referred to as "POPS." POPS identifies and provides vocational-andemployability-skills training and placement programs and initiatives to youths between the ages of 16 and 18 years who may also qualify for the Department of Juvenile Justice's initiative programs for youth who have significant family troubles; have significant school troubles; have experienced drug or alcohol use, or both; or exhibit predelinquent behavior.

(2) During the 2005-2006 fiscal year, a pilot Professional Opportunities Program for Students may be conducted in the central region of the state. In order to receive funding under this act, a POPS entity must submit to the Department of

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Juvenile Justice by September 1, 2005, a proposal for a training and placement program for youths between the ages of 16 and 18 years who reside in Brevard County, Lake County, Osceola County, Orange County, Seminole County, or Volusia County. The program should include up to 6 months of education and training and appropriate followup, including documentation of the percentage of the youths who have been placed in jobs for which training was provided under the program since its inception and the percentage of those youths who remain in such jobs for at least 3 months after their placement. By January 1, 2006, the POPS entity that has received funding under this act shall provide to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives a report that includes an itemized list of program costs; the statistics on job placement and retention of the youths served by the program; and recommendations for further legislation, including an opinion as to the feasibility of extending such programs throughout the state.

Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Juvenile Justice for the 2005-2006 fiscal year an amount sufficient to fund a pilot project that has been proposed by the Professional Opportunities Program for Students (POPS) and approved by the department as provided in subsection (2) of section 1 of this act.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
