House Memorial

A memorial to the President and Congress of the United States, urging the President and Congress to expedite the reauthorization of the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century.

WHEREAS, the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century, commonly called TEA-21, enacted June 9, 1998, expired on September 30, 2003, and

WHEREAS, short-term federal transportation funding has been maintained without disruption through the passage of six extensions, the latest of which expires May 31, 2005, and

WHEREAS, the Bush Administration, the United States Senate, and the United States House of Representatives have developed proposed legislation that differ in some respects, primarily funding levels, and

WHEREAS, for fiscal year 2004-2005, the Florida Department of Transportation received \$1.5 billion in federal transportation funds that were used to plan, build, improve, and maintain federal and state roads and bridges and to plan and finance aviation, rail, and public transit projects, and

WHEREAS, federal transportation funds supply about onethird of Florida's transportation budget, and

WHEREAS, Florida depends on a stable source of federal funding to successfully plan for and implement its statutorily required 5-year work program, and

WHEREAS, Florida is the nation's third-fastest growing state with varied transportation access needs to improve mobility, travel safety, and economic development for its citizens, and
