35.06 Organization of district courts of appeal.--A 2 district court of appeal shall be organized in each of the five appellate districts to be named District Court of Appeal, 3 District. SENATE SUMMARY Increases the number of circuit court judges in certain circuits and increases the number of county court judges in certain counties. Increases the number of district court judges in the second and fifth district courts of appeal. Provides for filling the offices of the new circuit and county court judges in the 2006 general election.
