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and private agencies, and private individuals and corporations in carrying out the purposes of, and the responsibilities established in, this chapter.

(e) The department shall develop and implement a written
and performance-based testing and evaluation program to ensure
measurable competencies of all employees assigned to <u>report</u>,
manage, or supervise cases of child abuse, abandonment, and
neglect. <u>All employees assigned to report</u>, manage, or supervise
<u>cases of child abuse</u>, abandonment, and neglect shall complete a
<u>1-hour continuing education course on child abuse each year</u>.

34 Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section35 39.201, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

36 39.201 Mandatory reports of child abuse, abandonment, or 37 neglect; mandatory reports of death; central abuse hotline.--38 (1)

(b) <u>Reporters licensed or regulated by the state and their</u> employees who are mandatory reporters are required to complete a <u>1-hour continuing education course on child abuse each year,</u> except for reporters in subparagraphs 1. and 2. Reporters in the following occupation categories are required to provide their names to the hotline staff:

1. Physician, osteopathic physician, medical examiner,
chiropractic physician, nurse, or hospital personnel engaged in
the admission, examination, care, or treatment of persons;

48 2. Health or mental health professional other than one49 listed in subparagraph 1.;

3. Practitioner who relies solely on spiritual means forhealing;
