2	A joint resolution proposing an amendment to
3	Section 4 of Article VI of the State
4	Constitution, relating to suffrage and
5	elections, to authorize the Legislature to
6	provide the conditions under which a convicted
7	felon's right to register or vote may be

10	Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
11	
12	That the following amendment to Section 4 of Article VI
13	of the State Constitution is agreed to and shall be submitted
14	to the electors of this state for approval or rejection at the
15	next general election or at an earlier special election
16	specifically authorized by law for that purpose:
17	ARTICLE VI
18	SUFFRAGE AND ELECTIONS
19	SECTION 4. Disqualifications
20	(a) No person convicted of a felony, or adjudicated in
21	this or any other state to be mentally incompetent, shall be
22	qualified to vote or hold office until restoration of civil
23	rights or removal of disability. No person convicted of a
24	felony shall be qualified to vote until the person's right to
25	register or vote has been restored as provided by law. No
26	person adjudicated in this or any other state to be mentally
27	incompetent shall be qualified to vote until removal of
28	disability.
29	(b) No person may appear on the ballot for re-election
30	to any of the following offices:
31	(1) Florida representative,

1	(2) Florida senator,
2	(3) Florida Lieutenant governor, <u>or</u>
3	(4) any office of the Florida cabinet,
4	(5) U.S. Representative from Florida, or
5	(6) U.S. Senator from Florida
6	
7	if, by the end of the current term of office, the person will
8	have served (or, but for resignation, would have served) in
9	that office for eight consecutive years.
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following statement be
11	placed on the ballot:
12	CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
13	ARTICLE VI, SECTION 4
14	QUALIFICATIONS OF FELONS TO VOTE Proposing an
15	amendment to the State Constitution authorizing the
16	Legislature to provide the conditions under which a convicted
17	felon's right to register or vote may be restored by statute,
18	and removing inoperative provisions relating to term limits
19	for members of Congress and U.S. Senators, which provisions
20	have been determined by the U.S. Supreme Court to violate the
21	U.S. Constitution.
