(5) (5) (a) The order granting temporary custody of the
minor child to the petitioner may not include an order for the
support of the child unless the parent has received personal
or substituted service of process, the petition requests an
order for the support of the child, and there is evidence of
the parent's ability to pay the support ordered.
(b) The order granting temporary custody may redirect
all or part of an existing child support obligation to be paid
to the extended family member who is granted temporary custody
of the child. If the court redirects an existing child support
obligation, the clerk of the circuit court in which the
temporary custody order is entered shall transmit a certified
copy thereof to the court originally entering the child
support order. The temporary custody order shall be recorded
and filed in the original action in which child support was
determined and become a part thereof.
(7) At any time, either or both of the child's parents
may petition the court to modify or terminate the order
granting temporary custody. The court shall terminate the
order upon a finding that the parent requesting the
termination of the order is a fit parent, or by consent of the
parties. The court may modify an order granting temporary
custody if the parties consent or if modification is in the
best interest of the child.

An act relating to temporary custody of a child by an extended family member or putative father; amending s. 751.011, F.S.; defining the term "extended family member"; amending s. 751.02, F.S.; authorizing an extended family member to bring a proceeding in court to determine the temporary custody of a child; amending s. 751.03, F.S.; specifying the information that must be included in a petition for temporary custody by an extended family member or putative father; providing that only an extended family member or putative father may file a petition for temporary custody under ch. 751, F.S.; amending s. 751.05, F.S.; authorizing a court to redirect child support payments to an extended family member; providing that either or both of the child's parents may petition the court to modify the order granting temporary custody under certain circumstances; authorizing the court to modify an order granting temporary custody under certain conditions; providing an effective date.
