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22	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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24	Section 1. (1)(a) The Legislature finds that:
25	1. Manufactured and mobile homes provide safe and
26	affordable housing to many residents of this state.
27	2. There is a substantial state interest in helping these
28	residents improve their home's hurricane preparedness since many
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29 of the residents living in this type of housing are on fixed or 30 low incomes. The 2004 and 2005 hurricane seasons proved that 31 3. 32 manufactured and mobile homes constructed and installed in 33 compliance with building codes adopted after Hurricane Andrew 34 withstood major hurricanes. 35 The 2004 and 2005 hurricane seasons demonstrated 4. 36 specific causes of property loss in manufactured and mobile 37 homes and that those causes can be addressed and property loss significantly reduced through various mitigation and enhancement 38 39 techniques. 40 There is a crisis in obtaining property insurance for 5. manufactured and mobile homes and the Citizens Property 41 42 Insurance Corporation has become the primary insurer of manufactured and mobile homes in this state. 43 44 (b) Based upon the findings set forth in paragraph (a), it 45 is the intent of the Legislature that the property insurance 46 premiums charged by the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation 47 for manufactured and mobile homes shall reflect: The improvements created through the mitigation and 48 1. 49 enhancement techniques developed under the program set forth in 50 this section. 51 The location of the home. 2. The fact that a home has been constructed and installed 52 3. in compliance with building codes adopted after Hurricane 53 54 Andrew. There is created the Manufactured Housing and Mobile 55 (2) 56 Home Mitigation and Enhancement Program. The purpose of the Page 2 of 4

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program is to enhance and improve the performance of

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manufactured and mobile homes during storm events in order to reduce property loss. Tallahassee Community College shall develop this (3) program in consultation with the Federation of Manufactured Home Owners of Florida, Inc., the Florida Manufactured Housing Association, and the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. (4) The program shall require the mitigation of damage to or enhancement of homes for the areas of concern raised by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in the 2004-2005 Hurricane Reports on the effects of the 2004 and 2005 hurricanes on manufactured and mobile homes in this state. The mitigation or enhancement shall include, but not be limited to, problems associated with weakened trusses, studs, and other structural components caused by wood rot or termite damage; site-built additions; or tie-down systems and may also address any other issues deemed appropriate by the Federation of Manufactured Home Owners of Florida, Inc., the Florida Manufactured Housing Association, and the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. The program shall include an education and outreach component to ensure that owners of manufactured and mobile homes are aware of the benefits of participation. The program shall be a grant program that ensures (5) entire manufactured home communities and mobile home parks may be improved wherever practicable. The moneys appropriated for this program shall be distributed directly to Tallahassee

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85 (6) (a) Upon evidence of completion of the program, the 86 Citizens Property Insurance Corporation shall grant insurance discounts, credits, or other rate differentials or appropriate 87 88 reductions in the deductible for the manufactured home owner's 89 or mobile home owner's property insurance premium for that year, 90 on a pro rata basis. The discount on the premium shall be 91 applied to subsequent renewal premium amounts. 92 (b) Premiums of the Citizens Property Insurance 93 Corporation shall reflect the location of the home and the fact 94 that the home has been installed in compliance with building 95 codes adopted after Hurricane Andrew. (7) (a) The portion of the program that enhances tie-down 96 systems shall continue to be funded by the moneys allocated in 97 98 s. 215.559(4), Florida Statutes. The remainder of the program shall be funded as 99 (b) 100 provided in the General Appropriations Act. The sum of \$7,500,000 is appropriated for 101 Section 2. 102 fiscal year 2006-2007 from the General Revenue Fund to the 103 Tallahassee Community College to implement the Manufactured 104 Housing and Mobile Home Mitigation and Enhancement Program 105 created by this act. This section shall take effect July 1, 106 2006. 107 Section 3. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law. 108

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
