shall be considered a breach of the contract and constitutes grounds for revocation of the contract. (2) Each state agency shall comply with the provisions of section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, 29 U.S.C. s. 794(d), when contracting to purchase commodities or services and when conducting any agency activities relating to access and use of electronic information and technology. (3) Pursuant to chapter 120, the department shall adopt any rules necessary to administer, implement, and enforce this section. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
