23	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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25	Section 1. Section 400.191, Florida Statutes, is
26	amended to read:
27	400.191 Availability, distribution, and posting of
28	reports and records
29	(1) The agency shall provide information to the public
30	about all of the licensed nursing home facilities operating in
	the state. The agency shall, within 60 days after an annual
31	the state. The agency shall, within ou days after an annual

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inspection visit or within 30 days after any interim visit to 1 2 a facility, send copies of the inspection reports to the local long-term care ombudsman council, the agency's local office, 3 and a public library or the county seat for the county in 4 which the facility is located. The agency may provide 5 electronic access to inspection reports as a substitute for б 7 sending copies. 8 (2) The agency shall publish the Nursing Home Guide annually provide additional information in consumer-friendly 9 printed form and guarterly in electronic form formats to 10 assist consumers and their families in comparing and 11 evaluating nursing home facilities. 12 13 (a) The agency shall provide an Internet site which 14 shall include at least the following information either directly or indirectly through a link to another established 15 site or sites of the agency's choosing: 16 A section entitled "Have you considered programs 17 18 that provide alternatives to nursing home care?" which shall be the first section of the Nursing Home Guide and which shall 19 prominently display information about available alternatives 20 to nursing homes and how to obtain additional information 21 22 regarding these alternatives. The Nursing Home Guide shall 23 explain that this state offers alternative programs that 24 permit qualified elderly persons to stay in their homes instead of being placed in nursing homes and shall encourage 25 26 interested persons to call the Comprehensive Assessment Review and Evaluation for Long-Term Care Services (CARES) Program to 27 28 inquire if they qualify. The Nursing Home Guide shall list 29 available home and community-based programs which shall clearly state the services that are provided and indicate 30 whether nursing home services are included if needed. 31

The religious affiliation, if any, of each 16 17 facility. 18 9.8. The languages spoken by the administrator and 19 staff of each facility. 10.9. Whether or not each facility accepts Medicare or 20 Medicaid recipients or insurance, health maintenance 21 22 organization, Veterans Administration, CHAMPUS program, or 23 workers' compensation coverage. 24 11.10. Recreational and other programs available at each facility. 25 12.11. Special care units or programs offered at each 26 facility. 27 28 13. $\frac{12}{12}$. Whether the facility is a part of a retirement 29 community that offers other services pursuant to part III, part IV, or part V. 30 31

2	the Online Survey Certification and Reporting (OSCAR) system
3	of the federal Health Care Financing Administration , including
4	all federal and state recertification, licensure annual
5	survey, revisit, and complaint survey information, for each
6	facility for the past 30 45 months. For noncertified nursing
7	homes, state survey and deficiency information, including
8	licensure annual survey, revisit, and complaint survey
9	information for the past 30 45 months shall be provided.
10	<u>15.14.</u> A summary of the <u>deficiency</u> Online Survey
11	Certification and Reporting (OSCAR) data for each facility
12	over the past <u>30</u> 45 months. <u>The</u> Such summary may include a
13	score, rating, or comparison ranking with respect to other
14	facilities based on the number of citations received by the
15	facility <u>on recertification, licensure</u> of annual , revisit, and
16	complaint surveys; the severity and scope of the citations;
17	and the number of annual recertification surveys the facility

Whether or not each facility accepts Medicare or Medicaid recipients or insurance, health maintenance 25 organization, Veterans Administration, CHAMPUS program, or 26 workers' compensation coverage. 27 28 10.9. Recreational programs, special care units, and 29 other programs available at each facility. 30 11.10. The Internet address for the site where more 31 detailed information can be seen.

A statement advising consumers that each 1 facility will have its own policies and procedures related to 2 3 protecting resident property. 13.12. A summary of the deficiency Online Survey 4 Certification and Reporting (OSCAR) data for each facility 5 over the past 30 45 months. The Such summary may include a б 7 score, rating, or comparison ranking with respect to other 8 facilities based on the number of citations received by the facility on recertification, licensure annual, revisit, and 9 complaint surveys; the severity and scope of the citations; 10 the number of citations; and the number of annual 11 recertification surveys the facility has had during the past 12 13 <u>30</u> 45 months. The score, rating, or comparison ranking may be 14 presented in either numeric or symbolic form for the intended consumer audience. 15 (c) For purposes of this subsection, references to the 16 Online Survey Certification and Reporting (OSCAR) system shall 17 18 refer to any future system that the Health Care Financing 19 Administration develops to replace the current OSCAR system. (c) (d) The agency may provide the following additional 20 information on an Internet site or in printed form as the 21 22 information becomes available: 23 1. The licensure status history of each facility. 24 2. The rating history of each facility. 3. The regulatory history of each facility, which may 25 include federal sanctions, state sanctions, federal fines, 26 state fines, and other actions. 27 28 4. Whether the facility currently possesses the Gold 29 Seal designation awarded pursuant to s. 400.235. 5. Internet links to the Internet sites of the 30 31 facilities or their affiliates.

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(3) Each nursing home facility licensee shall maintain 1 2 as public information, available upon request, records of all 3 cost and inspection reports pertaining to that facility that have been filed with, or issued by, any governmental agency. 4 Copies of the such reports shall be retained in the such 5 records for not less than 5 years following from the date the б 7 reports are filed or issued. 8 (a) The agency shall quarterly publish in the Nursing 9 Home Guide a "Nursing Home Guide Watch List" to assist consumers in evaluating the quality of nursing home care in 10 Florida. The watch list must identify each facility that met 11 the criteria for a conditional licensure status on any day 12 13 within the quarter covered by the list and each facility that 14 is was operating under bankruptcy protection on any day within the quarter. The watch list must include, but is not limited 15 to, the facility's name, address, and ownership; the county in 16 which the facility operates; the license expiration date; the 17 18 number of licensed beds; a description of the deficiency 19 causing the facility to be placed on the list; any corrective action taken; and the cumulative number of days and percentage 20 of days times the facility had a conditional license in the 21 22 past 30 months has been on a watch list. The watch list must 23 include a brief description regarding how to choose a nursing 24 home, the categories of licensure, the agency's inspection process, an explanation of terms used in the watch list, and 25 the addresses and phone numbers of the agency's managed care 26 and health quality assurance field area offices. 27 28 (b) Upon publication of each Nursing Home Guide 29 quarterly watch list, the agency must post transmit a copy on its website by the 15th calendar day of the second month 30

31 <u>following the end of the calendar quarter. Each nursing home</u>

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licensee must retrieve the most recent version of the Nursing 1 2 Home Guide from of the watch list to each nursing home facility by mail and must make the watch list available on the 3 agency's Internet website. 4 (4) Any records of a nursing home facility determined 5 by the agency to be necessary and essential to establish б 7 lawful compliance with any rules or standards <u>must</u> shall be 8 made available to the agency on the premises of the facility and submitted to the agency. Each facility must submit this 9 information to the agency by electronic transmission when 10 available. 11 (5) Every nursing home facility licensee shall: 12 13 (a) Post, in a sufficient number of prominent 14 positions in the nursing home so as to be accessible to all residents and to the general public: 15 1. A concise summary of the last inspection report 16 pertaining to the nursing home and issued by the agency, with 17 18 references to the page numbers of the full reports, noting any deficiencies found by the agency and the actions taken by the 19 licensee to rectify the such deficiencies and indicating in 20 the such summaries where the full reports may be inspected in 21 the nursing home. 2.2 23 2. A copy of all of the pages that list the facility 24 in the most recent version of the Florida Nursing Home Guide Watch List. 25 (b) Upon request, provide to any person who has 26 completed a written application with an intent to be admitted 27 28 to, or to any resident of, <u>a</u> such nursing home, or to any 29 relative, spouse, or guardian of the such person, a copy of the last inspection report pertaining to the nursing home and 30 31 issued by the agency, provided the person requesting the

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   costs.
