4 5 6	Provides that the free notarization available to veterans, firefighters, and law enforcement officers is only available from a notary employed by a state agency performing the notarial act as part of their assigned duties.
0 7 8	Provides that the notarial act is indicated by the affixing of the notary's seal accompanied by a written certificate or jurat.
9	Provides that the journal may be kept in electronic form.
10	Provides that notaries licensed in Florida and their notary employees are exempt from the journal requirement.
11	Provides that certain law enforcement officers are exempt from the journal requirements.
