Section 296.36, Florida Statutes, is 13 amended to read: 296.36 Eligibility and priority of admittance.--14 (1) To be eligible for admittance to the home, the 15 person must be a veteran as defined in s. 1.01(14) and must: 16 17 (a) Be in need of nursing home care. (b) Have been a resident of the state for 1 year 18 immediately preceding, and at the time of application for, 19 20 admission to the home. 21 (c) Not owe money to the department for services 22 rendered during any previous stay at a department facility. 23 (d) Have applied for all financial assistance reasonably available through governmental sources. 24 (2) The director may waive the residency requirement 25 for a veteran who is otherwise eligible for admittance to a 26 27 home. The waiver must be limited to a veteran who is a 2.8 disaster evacuee of a state that is under a declared state of 29 emergency. 30 (3)(2) Admittance priority must be given to an eliqible veteran afforded in the following order of priority 31

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to an eligible veteran who is in need of nursing home care and who: (a) An eligible veteran who is a resident of the State of Florida. (b)(a) An eligible veteran who has a service-connected disability as determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, or was discharged or released from military service for disability incurred or aggravated in the line of duty and the disability is the condition for which nursing home care is needed. (c)(b) An eliqible veteran who has a non-service-connected disability and is unable to defray the expense of nursing home care and so states under oath before a notary public or other officer authorized to administer an oath. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006. SENATE SUMMARY Authorizes the director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs to waive the residency requirement for admittance to a veterans' nursing home under certain circumstances.

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
