**Senate Amendment (with title amendment)**

Delete everything after the enacting clause,

and insert:

Section 1. Section 985.2075, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

985.2075 Youth custody officer.--

(1) There is created within the department of Juvenile Justice the position of youth custody officer. The primary duties of each youth custody officer shall be to take youth into custody if the officer has probable cause to believe that the youth has violated the conditions of probation, home detention, conditional release, or postcommitment probation; has escaped from a facility operated by or under contract with the department; has absconded from the supervision of the department; or has failed to appear in court after being properly noticed. The authority of the youth custody officer to take youth into custody is specifically limited to this
