The Legislature finds that it is a public 37 Section 2. necessity that a patient's medical or health record held by the 38 39 Florida Health Information Network, Inc., a not-for-profit 40 corporation, be made confidential and exempt from public records 41 requirements. Matters of personal health are traditionally 42 private and confidential concerns between the patient and the health care provider. The private and confidential nature of 43 personal health matters pervades both the public and private 44 health care sectors. For these reasons, the individual's 45 46 expectation of and right to privacy in all matters regarding his 47 or her personal health necessitates this exemption. The Legislature further finds that it is a public necessity to 48 49 protect a patient's medical record or health record because the 50 release of such record could be defamatory to the patient or could cause unwarranted damage to the name or reputation of that 51 52 patient. The Legislature also finds that it is a public 53 necessity to protect the release of a trade secret as defined in

54 s. 688.002, Florida Statutes. A trade secret derives independent 55 economic value, actual or potential, from not being generally 56 known to, and not being readily ascertainable by proper means 57 by, other persons who can obtain economic value from its disclosure or use. Without an exemption from public records 58 59 requirements for a trade secret as defined in s. 688.002, Florida Statutes, that trade secret becomes a public record when 60 held by the Florida Health Information Network, Inc., and must 61 62 be divulged upon request. Divulgence of any trade secret under the public records law would destroy the value of that property. 63 64 Release of that information would give business competitors an 65 unfair advantage and weaken the position of the corporation in 66 the marketplace. Thus, the Legislature finds that it is a public 67 necessity that a trade secret be made confidential and exempt from public records requirements. Finally, the Legislature finds 68 69 that it is a public necessity to protect information received by 70 the Florida Health Information Network, Inc., from a person from 71 another state or nation or the Federal Government which is 72 otherwise exempt or confidential pursuant to the laws of that 73 state or nation or pursuant to federal law. Without this 74 protection, another state or nation or the Federal Government 75 might be less likely to provide information to the corporation 76 in the furtherance of its duties and responsibilities. 77 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006, if 78 House Bill 1409 or similar legislation is adopted in the same 79 legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.
