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CS 22 The following information held by the Florida Center (1) 23 for Brain Tumor Research is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24, Art. I of the State Constitution: 24 25 (a) An individual's medical record. Any information received from an individual from 26 (b) 27 another state or nation or the Federal Government that is otherwise confidential or exempt pursuant to the laws of that 28 29 state or nation or pursuant to federal law. This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset 30 (2) Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed 31 32 on October 2, 2011, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 33 34 The Legislature finds that it is a public Section 2. 35 necessity that an individual's medical record held by the brain tumor registry developed pursuant to s. 381.853(3), Florida 36 37 Statutes, be made confidential and exempt from public records requirements. Matters of personal health are traditionally 38 private and confidential concerns between the patient and the 39 health care provider. The private and confidential nature of 40 personal health matters pervades both the public and private 41 health care sectors. For these reasons, the individual's 42 43 expectation of and right to privacy in all matters regarding his or her personal health necessitates this exemption. The 44 Legislature further finds that it is a public necessity to 45 protect a patient's medical record because the release of such 46 47 record could be defamatory to the patient or could cause unwarranted damage to the name or reputation of that patient. 48 49 Finally, the Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to Page 2 of 3

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50	protect information received by the brain tumor registry from an
51	individual from another state or nation or the Federal
52	Government that is otherwise exempt or confidential pursuant to
53	the laws of that state or nation or pursuant to federal law.
54	Without this protection, another state or nation or the Federal
55	Government might be less likely to provide information to the
56	registry in the furtherance of its duties and responsibilities.
57	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006, if
58	House Bill 1449 or similar legislation is adopted in the same
59	legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.

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
