A bill to be entitled

An act relating to children in foster care; providing for the creation of the Community Advisory Panel on Foster Care Pilot Program in Duval County; providing purposes and goals; providing for administration of the program by community-based care; providing for hiring personnel; creating the Community Advisory Panel on Foster Care; providing for panel membership; providing for a chairperson; providing duties of specified county judges, the personnel, and the panel; requiring research to determine the effectiveness of the program; requiring an annual report to the court and to legislative leaders; providing for future expiration of the pilot program; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. <u>Community Advisory Panel on Foster Care Pilot Program; creation; purpose; administration; panel membership;</u>
 duties of court and panel; evaluation.--
- (1) There is created the Community Advisory Panel on Foster Care Pilot Program in Duval County. The purpose of the program is to identify educational needs and followup strategies for foster children who are 6 through 12 years of age and are enrolled in the Duval County school system. The goal of the program is to ensure that youth who are in foster care will be tested appropriately and placed in an educational environment that optimizes their opportunities for success.

(2) The community-based care (CBC) shall administer the pilot program. The CBC shall employ a full-time project coordinator who shall assist the student's case manager in identifying resources for such assessment and treatment. The CBC shall also employ a full-time psychologist who will provide advice, research, assessments, and other services to the judges and to foster children and their families.

- (3) The chief judge for the Fourth Judicial Circuit or his or her designee shall create the Community Advisory Panel on Foster Care, which will consist of 15 community volunteers who are community leaders that have diverse areas of expertise and talent. The chief judge who is responsible for dependency and adoption in the Fourth Judicial Circuit or his or her designee shall appoint four members of the panel; the Department of Children and Family Services shall appoint four members; the county school board shall appoint four members; and the guardian ad litem for Duval County shall appoint three members. The judge shall chair the panel.
- information relating to students who are 6 to 12 years of age and are in the foster care system in District IV of the department. The panel shall review the academic progress, behavioral issues, and attendance of each student and shall recommend referral of any student for whom the review demonstrates a need for followup services. The panel may prioritize referrals by assessing the severity of need and recommending that the most critical needs be met first. A student who is failing must be referred for educational testing,

for additional psychological and therapeutic counseling as recommended, or for both, to determine why he or she is failing and what accommodations and remediation are needed.

- (5) The project coordinator shall oversee the development of a research component, or assessment tool, that is designed to determine the effectiveness of the pilot program.
- (a) The research data must be set up to link systems among providers of educational services, psychological services, case management, and the court system.
- (b) The entity that designs the assessment tool must, during the first year of the pilot program, undertake the following tasks:
- 1. Discovery. This phase includes meeting with information technology staff from the department, school board staff, and caseworkers.
- 2. Development. This phase consists of determining the best method for data entry, the best database, and the best data format.
- 3. Implementation. This phase comprises completing, testing, and delivering the assessment tool.
- 4. Maintenance. This phase involves developing a maintenance plan and schedule, after the initiation of the assessment methodology.
- (6) The project coordinator shall submit an annual report to the court and to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
 - (7) The pilot program expires on July 1, 2009.
 - Section 2. The sum of \$300,000 is appropriated from the
