A bill to be entitled An act relating to financial assistance for postsecondary students; creating s. 1009.892, F.S.; creating the Florida Reimbursement Grant Program to Provide Postsecondary Psycho-Academic Testing to Students with Disabilities; providing for rulemaking by the State Board of Education; providing that the Department of Education shall administer the program; providing legislative intent; providing eligibility requirements; prescribing a limit on testing costs; providing that the cost of psycho-academic testing is part of the student's attendance cost; requiring a student who applies for such a grant to apply for a Pell Grant; providing that Pell Grant entitlement must be considered in determining a student's monetary need for a grant under this section; requiring participating institutions to report specified information to the department; requiring that the amount of such grants be specified in the General Appropriations Act; providing procedures; requiring participating institutions to return undisbursed grant moneys to the department; providing that the act be implemented only to the extent that it is funded and authorized; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 1009.892, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- (1) There is created the Florida Reimbursement Grant
  Program to Provide Postsecondary Psycho-Academic Testing for
  Students with Disabilities. The State Board of Education shall
  adopt rules for administering the program, and the department
  shall administer the program. It is the intent of the
  Legislature that this program provide to eligible students with
  disabilities reimbursement for postsecondary psycho-academic
  testing conducted by postsecondary institutions, or conducted by
  private providers under contract with postsecondary
  institutions, to assist in providing the appropriate
  accommodations and services for students who have specified
  learning and cognitive disabilities.
- (2)(a) A grant may be made under this section only to an eliqible student with disabilities who:
- 1. Is enrolled in a degree, certificate, or diploma program;
- 2. Is enrolled in at least 6 semester hours per term, or the equivalent thereof, at a state university, community college, or private postsecondary institution in this state which requires documentation for accommodations for disabilities;
- 3. Meets the general requirements for student eligibility as provided in s. 1009.40, except as otherwise provided in this section; and
  - 4. Has a disability or disabilities as documented under

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the Americans with Disabilities Act.

(b) The grants shall be awarded annually for the cost of psycho-academic testing required by participating institutions, and the postsecondary institution shall determine the cost in an amount not to exceed \$1,000.

- (c) Any required psycho-academic testing for students with disabilities must be considered a part of the student's cost of attendance. An eligible student with a disability who applies for a Florida Reimbursement Grant to Provide Postsecondary Psycho-Academic Testing for Students with Disabilities must also apply for the Pell Grant. A student's entitlement to a Pell Grant must be considered in determining need when conducting an assessment of the financial resources available to the student. The participating institution shall defer the cost of required psycho-academic testing for eligible students.
- (3) Each participating institution shall report to the department, by a date stipulated by the department, the number of eligible students to whom grant moneys are disbursed each academic term and the necessary demographic and eligibility data concerning such students.
- (4) (a) The amount that may be awarded for each grant under this section must be specified in the General Appropriations

  Act. The funds appropriated for such grants must be transmitted to the president of an eligible institution, or to his or her designated representative, in advance of the registration period.
- (b) A student's eligibility to receive a disbursement under this section shall be determined by each institution as of

the end of its regular registration period, inclusive of a dropadd period. The institution need not reevaluate a student's
eligibility status after that date for purposes of changing
eligibility determinations previously made. The institution in
which an eligible student is enrolled shall notify the student
of the amount of his or her award.

- (c) Each participating institution shall certify to the department the amount of funds disbursed to each eligible student under this section and shall remit to the department any undisbursed advances or refunds within 60 days after the end of regular registration.
- (5) This section shall be implemented only to the extent specifically funded and authorized by law.
