19	(9) An independent contractor who, under the
20	supervision of a person who is administering to the ills or
21	injuries of his or her own livestock, herd, or avian animals,
22	provides nonmedical health care services to the animals,
23	including, but not limited to, acupressure, aromatherapy,
24	animal communication, farriery, flower essence therapy,
25	homeopathy, light therapy, magnet therapy, massage therapy,
26	hydrotherapy, nutritional counseling, debeaking, dehorning,
27	and manual equine teeth floating. The owner of a herd animal
28	that is raised for food or fiber may engage independent
29	contractors to provide routine herd-management tasks,
30	including, but not limited to, castration and parasite

1 health care services for animals and is not a veterinarian 2 must: 3 (a) Obtain an occupational license from his or her county of residence; 4 5 (b) Advise each owner of an animal that will be 6 treated of his or her knowledge or experience with the 7 services that will be provided; 8 (c) Produce his or her credentials upon the request of an owner of an animal that is being treated; 9 10 (d) Refrain from engaging in animal cruelty; and (e) Refrain from advertising in any way that implies 11 12 that he or she is a veterinarian. 13 For the purposes of chapters 465 and 893, persons exempt 14 pursuant to subsection (1), subsection (2), or subsection (4) 15 are deemed to be duly licensed practitioners authorized by the 16 17 laws of this state to prescribe drugs or medicinal supplies. 18 Section 2.
