Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 322.18, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- (2) Each applicant who is entitled to the issuance of a driver's license, as provided in this section, shall be issued a driver's license, as follows:
- (a) An applicant applying for an original issuance shall be issued a driver's license which expires at midnight on the licensee's birthday which next occurs on or after the sixth anniversary of the date of issue.
- (b) An applicant applying for a renewal issuance or renewal extension shall be issued a driver's license or renewal extension sticker which expires at midnight on the licensee's birthday which next occurs 4 years after the month of expiration of the license being renewed, except that a driver whose driving record reflects no convictions for the preceding 3 years shall be issued a driver's license or 11:36 AM 03/13/06 s1752.tr16.444

- (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, if an applicant establishes his or her identity for a 5 driver's license using a document authorized under s. 7 322.08(2)(c)5., the driver's license shall expire in accordance with paragraph (b).  - (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, an applicant applying for an original or renewal issuance of a commercial driver's license as defined in s. 322.01(7), with a hazardous-materials endorsement, pursuant to s. 322.57(1)(e), shall be issued a driver's license that expires at midnight on the licensee's birthday that next occurs 4 years after the month of expiration of the license being issued or renewed.
 - (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, the driver's license of any person expires at midnight on the licensee's 80th birthday.
