Paragraph (d) of subsection (3) and subsection (8) of section 316.2065, Florida Statutes, are 14 amended to read: 15 316.2065 Bicycle regulations.--16 17 (3) A bicycle rider or passenger who is under 16 years 18 (d) of age must wear a bicycle helmet that is properly fitted and 19 is fastened securely upon the passenger's head by a strap, and 20 21 that meets the <u>federal safety standard for bicycle helmets</u>, final rule, 16 C.F.R. part 1203. Helmets purchased prior to 22 23 October 1, 2005, and meeting standards of the American National Standards Institute (ANSI Z 90.4 Bicycle Helmet 2.4 Standards), the standards of the Snell Memorial Foundation 25 (1984 Standard for Protective Headgear for Use in Bicycling), 26 27 or any other nationally recognized standards for bicycle 2.8 helmets adopted by the department may continue to be worn by riders or passengers until January 1, 2010. As used in this 29 subsection, the term "passenger" includes a child who is 30 riding in a trailer or semitrailer attached to a bicycle.

1 (8) Every bicycle in use between sunset and sunrise 2 shall be equipped with a lamp on the front exhibiting a white 3 light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the 4 front and a lamp and reflector on the rear each exhibiting a red light visible from a distance of 600 feet to the rear. A 5 6 bicycle or its rider may be equipped with lights or reflectors 7 in addition to those required by this section. Law enforcement officers and traffic infraction enforcement officers may issue 8 a bicycle safety brochure and a verbal warning to a bicycle 9 10 rider who violates this subsection. A bicycle rider who violates this subsection may be issued a citation by a law 11 12 enforcement officer or a traffic infraction enforcement 13 officer and assessed a fine for a pedestrian violation, as provided in s. 318.18. The court shall dismiss the charge 14 against a bicycle rider for a first violation of this 15 subsection upon proof of purchase and installation of the 16 17 proper lighting equipment. Section 2.
