Subsection (1) of section 501.207, Florida 8 Statutes, is reenacted, and subsection (3) of that section is amended to read: 9 10 501.207 Remedies of enforcing authority .--(1) The enforcing authority may bring: 11 12 (a) An action to obtain a declaratory judgment that an 13 act or practice violates this part. (b) An action to enjoin any person who has violated, 14 is violating, or is otherwise likely to violate, this part. 15 (c) An action on behalf of one or more consumers or 16 17 governmental entities for the actual damages caused by an act 18 or practice in violation of this part. However, damages are not recoverable under this section against a retailer who has 19 in good faith engaged in the dissemination of claims of a 20 21 manufacturer or wholesaler without actual knowledge that it 22 violated this part. 23 (3) Upon motion of the enforcing authority or any interested party in any action brought under subsection (1), 2.4 the court may make appropriate orders, including, but not 25 26 limited to, appointment of a general or special magistrate or 27 receiver or sequestration or freezing of assets, to reimburse 2.8 consumers or governmental entities found to have been damaged; to carry out a transaction in accordance with the reasonable 29 expectations of consumers or governmental entities; to strike 30 or limit the application of clauses of contracts to avoid an 31

3	divest herself or himself of any interest in any enterprise,
4	including real estate; to impose reasonable restrictions upon

7	order the dissolution or reorganization of any enterprise; or
8	to grant legal, equitable, or other appropriate relief. The
9	court may assess the expenses of a general or special
10	magistrate or receiver against a person who has violated, is
11	violating, or is otherwise likely to violate this part. Any
12	injunctive order, whether temporary or permanent, issued by
13	the court shall be effective throughout the state unless
14	otherwise provided in the order.
15	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
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
