Paragraph (f) is added to subsection (15) of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, to read: 14 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases 15 as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth 16 17 unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 18 (15)(f) Effective July 1, 2006, the term "special risk 19 member" includes any member who is employed by the Department 20 21 of Children and Family Services and meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(i). 22 23 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 2.4 121.0515 Special risk membership.--25 (2) CRITERIA. -- A member, to be designated as a special 26 27 risk member, must meet the following criteria: 2.8 (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 29 compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected 30 police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification

requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;

(b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of a local government employer or an agency of state government with firefighting responsibilities. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included and further provided that all periods of creditable service in fire prevention or firefighter training, or as the supervisor or

command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities, and for which the employer paid the special risk contribution rate, shall be included;

In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, wardens and assistant wardens, as defined by rule, shall participate in the Special Risk Class;
- Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have such responsibility. However, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;

(e) The member must be employed as a community-based 2 correctional probation officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, 3 the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the 4 supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and 5 6 counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or 7 community controllees within the community; or the member must be the supervisor of a member or members who have such 8 responsibilities. Administrative support personnel, including, 9 but not limited to, those whose primary duties and 10 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal 11 12 services, and personnel management, shall not be included; 13 however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class; 14 (f) The member must be employed in one of the 15 following classes and must spend at least 75 percent of his or 16 her time performing duties which involve contact with patients 18 or inmates in a correctional or forensic facility or institution: 19 1. Dietitian (class codes 5203 and 5204); 20 21 2. Public health nutrition consultant (class code 22 5224); 23 3. Psychological specialist (class codes 5230 and 5231); 2.4 4. Psychologist (class code 5234); 2.5 26 5. Senior psychologist (class codes 5237 and 5238); 27 Regional mental health consultant (class code 2.8 5240); 29 7. 5	Section 3. The Legislature finds that a proper and
6	legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees
7	of the state and its political subdivisions and the
8	dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and
9	retirees are extended the basic protections afforded by
10	governmental retirement systems. These persons must be
11	provided benefits that are fair and adequate and that are
12	managed, administered, and funded in a sound actuarial manner,
13	as required by s. 14, Art. X of the State Constitution and
14	part VII of chapter 112, Florida Statutes. Therefore, the
15	Legislature hereby determines and declares that this act
16	fulfills an important state interest.
17	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
