Paragraph (b) of subsection (6) of section 1013.64, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 14 1013.64 Funds for comprehensive educational plant 15 needs; construction cost maximums for school district capital 16 17 projects. -- Allocations from the Public Education Capital 18 Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund to the various boards for capital outlay projects shall be determined as follows: 19 (6) 20 (b)1. A district school board, including a district 2.1 22 school board of an academic performance-based charter school 23 district, must not use funds from the following sources: Public Education Capital Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund; 2.4 School District and Community College District Capital Outlay 25 and Debt Service Trust Fund; Classrooms First Program funds 26 27 provided in s. 1013.68; effort index grant funds provided in 2.8 s. 1013.73; nonvoted 2-mill levy of ad valorem property taxes provided in s. 1011.71(2); Classrooms for Kids Infrastructure 29 Program funds provided in s. 1013.735; or District Effort 30 Recognition Program funds provided in s. 1013.736 for any new

construction of educational plant space with a total cost per student station, including change orders, that equals more than:

- a. \$17,952\$12,755 for an elementary school,
- b.  $$19,386$\frac{$14,624}{}$  for a middle school, or
- c. \$25,181\$;19,352 for a high school,

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(January  $2006 \ 2002$ ) as adjusted annually to reflect increases or decreases in the Consumer Price Index.

2. A district school board must not use funds from the Public Education Capital Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund or the School District and Community College District Capital Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund for any new construction of an ancillary plant that exceeds 70 percent of the average cost per square foot of new construction for all schools.

Section 2. Paragraph (d) of subsection (1), paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (4), and paragraph (b) of subsection (9) of section 1011.62, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

1011.62 Funds for operation of schools.--If the annual allocation from the Florida Education Finance Program to each district for operation of schools is not determined in the annual appropriations act or the substantive bill implementing the annual appropriations act, it shall be determined as follows:

- (1) COMPUTATION OF THE BASIC AMOUNT TO BE INCLUDED FOR OPERATION. -- The following procedure shall be followed in determining the annual allocation to each district for operation:
  - (d) Annual allocation calculation. --
- 1. The Department of Education is authorized and directed to review all district programs and enrollment

projections and calculate a maximum total weighted full-time equivalent student enrollment for each district for the K-12 FEFP.

- 2. Maximum enrollments calculated by the department shall be derived from enrollment estimates used by the Legislature to calculate the FEFP. If two or more districts enter into an agreement under the provisions of s. 1001.42(4)(d), after the final enrollment estimate is agreed upon, the amount of FTE specified in the agreement, not to exceed the estimate for the specific program as identified in paragraph (c), may be transferred from the participating districts to the district providing the program.
- 3. As part of its calculation of each district's maximum total weighted full-time equivalent student enrollment, the department shall establish separate enrollment ceilings for each of two program groups. Group 1 shall be composed of basic programs for grades K-3, grades 4-8, and grades 9-12. Group 2 shall be composed of students in exceptional student education programs support levels IV and  $\underline{V}$ , English for Speakers of Other Languages programs, and all career programs in grades  $\underline{9-12}$   $\underline{7-12}$ .
- a. For any calculation of the FEFP, the enrollment ceiling for group 1 shall be calculated by multiplying the actual enrollment for each program group in the program by its appropriate program weight.
- <u>b.a.</u> The weighted enrollment ceiling for group 2 programs shall be calculated by multiplying the <u>final</u> enrollment <del>conference estimate</del> for each program by the appropriate program weight <u>as provided in the General</u>

  <u>Appropriations Act</u>. The weighted enrollment ceiling for program group 2 shall be the sum of the weighted enrollment

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ceilings for each program in the program group, plus the increase in weighted full-time equivalent student membership from the prior year for clients of the Department of Children and Family Services and the Department of Juvenile Justice.

c.b. If, for any calculation of the FEFP, the weighted enrollment for program group 2, derived by multiplying actual enrollments by appropriate program weights, exceeds the enrollment ceiling for that group, the following procedure shall be followed to reduce the weighted enrollment for that group to equal the enrollment ceiling:

- (I) The weighted enrollment ceiling for each program in the program group shall be subtracted from the weighted enrollment for that program derived from actual enrollments.
- (II) If the difference calculated under sub-sub-subparagraph (I) is greater than zero for any program, a reduction proportion shall be computed for the program by dividing the absolute value of the difference by the total amount by which the weighted enrollment for the program group exceeds the weighted enrollment ceiling for the program group.
- (III) The reduction proportion calculated under sub-sub-subparagraph (II) shall be multiplied by the total amount of the program group's enrollment over the ceiling as calculated under sub-subparagraph (I).
- (IV) The prorated reduction amount calculated under sub-sub-subparagraph (III) shall be subtracted from the program's weighted enrollment to produce a revised program weighted enrollment.
- (V) The prorated reduction amount calculated under sub-sub-subparagraph (III) shall be divided by the appropriate program weight and the result added to the revised program weighted enrollment computed in sub-sub-subparagraph (IV). For

any calculation of the FEFP, the enrollment ceiling for group 2 1 shall be calculated by multiplying the actual enrollment for 3 each program in the program group by its appropriate program 4 weight. 5 For program group 2, the weighted enrollment ceiling shall be a number not less than the sum obtained by: 7 (I) Multiplying the sum of reported FTE for all 8 programs in the program group that have a cost factor of 1.0 9 or more by 1.0, and 10 (II) By adding this number to the sum obtained by multiplying the projected FTE for all programs with a cost 11 factor less than 1.0 by the actual cost factor. 12 13 4. Following completion of the weighted enrollment ceiling calculation as provided in subparagraph 3., a 14 supplemental capping calculation shall be employed for those 15 districts that are over their weighted enrollment ceiling. For 16 each such district, the total reported unweighted FTE 18 enrollment for group 2 programs shall be compared with the total appropriated unweighted FTE enrollment for group 2 19 programs. If the total reported unweighted FTE for group 2 is 2.0 21 greater than the appropriated unweighted FTE, then the excess 2.2 unweighted FTE up to the unweighted FTE transferred from group 23 2 to group 1 for each district by the Public School FTE Estimating Conference shall be funded at a weight of 1.0 and 2.4 added to the funded weighted FTE computed in subparagraph 3. 2.5 26 Section 3. 11	COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR <u>Senate Bill 2380</u>
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13	The committee substitute provides an appropriation of \$1.1
14	billion for class size reduction capital outlay and \$50 million for debt service on lottery funded bonds. The
15	committee substitute removes the one year delay for school districts to comply with school level class size reduction requirements. In addition, it revises the methodology for
16	calculating the weighted enrollment ceiling for group 2
17	programs within the Florida Education Finance Program (FEFP) so that school districts will be funded at a weight of 1.0 for weighted FTE in excess of the weighted enrollment ceiling for
18	any calculation of the FEFP.
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
