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17	Section 1. (1) Effective June 1, 2006, through June

21	<u>\$20 or less.</u>									
22	(b) Any portable self-powered radio, two-way radio, or									
23	<u>weatherband radio selling for \$50 or less.</u>									
24	(c) Any tarpaulin or other flexible waterproof									
25	<u>sheeting selling for \$50 or less.</u>									
26	(d) Any self-contained first-aid kit selling for \$30									
27	<u>or less.</u>									
28	<u>(e) Any ground anchor system or tie-down kit selling</u>									
29	<u>for \$50 or less.</u>									
30	(f) Any gas or diesel fuel tank selling for \$25 or

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1	(q) Any package of AAA-cell, AA-cell, C-cell, D-cell,								
2	<u>6-volt, or 9-volt batteries, excluding automobile and boat</u>

4	(h) Any cell phone battery selling for \$60 or less and								
5	any cell phone charger selling for \$40 or less.								
6	(i) Any nonelectric food storage cooler selling for								
7	\$30 or less.								
8	(j) Any portable generator used to provide light or								
9	communications or preserve food in the event of a power outage								
10	<u>selling for \$1,000 or less.</u>								
11	(k) Any building materials, consisting of plywood and								
12	hardware used to secure plywood to a structure, selling for								
13	<u>\$300 or less.</u>								
14	1. Building materials purchased by a construction
