This act may be cited as the "Citizens' 14 15 Empowerment Act." Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 16 17 97.041, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 97.041 Qualifications to register or vote.--18 (2) The following persons, who might be otherwise 19 qualified, are not entitled to register or vote: 20 21 (b) A person who has been convicted of any felony by 22 any court of record; however, such a person's right to 23 register or vote is automatically restored by operation of law 1 year after completion and satisfaction of all sentences 2.4 imposed upon such person. For the purposes of this paragraph, 25 26 <u>"completion and satisfaction of all sentences" occurs when a</u> 27 person is released from incarceration upon expiration of 2.8 sentence and has achieved or completed all other nonmonetary terms and conditions of the sentence or subsequent supervision 29 or, if the person has not been incarcerated for the felony 30 offense, has achieved or completed all nonmonetary terms and 31

conditions of community supervision imposed by a court and who 1 2 has not had his or her right to vote restored pursuant to law. If a majority of the Board of Executive Clemency objects 3 4 before the automatic restoration of the right to register or 5 vote, such rights shall be restored only upon application to, б and approval by, the Board of Executive Clemency. 7 Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 97.052, Florida 8 Statutes, is amended to read: 9 97.052 Uniform statewide voter registration 10 application.--(2) The uniform statewide voter registration 11 12 application must be designed to elicit the following 13 information from the applicant: (a) Last, first, and middle name, including any 14 15 suffix. (b) Date of birth. 16 17 (c) Address of legal residence. (d) Mailing address, if different. 18 (e) County of legal residence. 19 (f) Race or ethnicity that best describes the 20 21 applicant: 22 1. American Indian or Alaskan Native. 23 2. Asian or Pacific Islander. 3. Black, not Hispanic. 2.4 4. White, not Hispanic. 25 5. Hispanic. 26 27 (q) State or country of birth. 28 (h) Sex. (i) Party affiliation. 29 30 (j) Whether the applicant needs assistance in voting. (k) Name and address where last registered. 31

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1 (1) Last four digits of the applicant's social 2 security number. 3 (m) Florida driver's license number or the 4 identification number from a Florida identification card issued under s. 322.051. 5 6 (n) An indication, if applicable, that the applicant 7 has not been issued a Florida driver's license, a Florida identification card, or a social security number. 8 (o) Telephone number (optional). 9 10 (p) Signature of applicant under penalty for false swearing pursuant to s. 104.011, by which the person 11 12 subscribes to the oath required by s. 3, Art. VI of the State Constitution and s. 97.051, and swears or affirms that the 13 information contained in the registration application is true. 14 (q) Whether the application is being used for initial 15 registration, to update a voter registration record, or to 16 17 request a replacement voter information card. (r) Whether the applicant is a citizen of the United 18 States by asking the question "Are you a citizen of the United 19 States of America?" and providing boxes for the applicant to 20 21 check to indicate whether the applicant is or is not a citizen 22 of the United States. 23 (s) Whether the applicant has been convicted of a felony, and, if convicted, has had his or her voting civil 2.4 rights restored by including the statement "I affirm I am not 25 a convicted felon, or, if I am, my rights relating to voting 26 27 have been restored." and providing a box for the applicant to 2.8 check to affirm the statement. (t) Whether the applicant has been adjudicated 29 30 mentally incapacitated with respect to voting or, if so adjudicated, has had his or her right to vote restored by 31 3

1 including the statement "I affirm I have not been adjudicated 2 mentally incapacitated with respect to voting, or, if I have, my competency has been restored." and providing a box for the 3 applicant to check to affirm the statement. 4 5 6 The registration application must be in plain language and 7 designed so that convicted felons whose voting civil rights have been restored and persons who have been adjudicated 8 mentally incapacitated and have had their voting rights 9 restored are not required to reveal their prior conviction or 10 adjudication. 11 12 Section 4. Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 13 97.053, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 97.053 Acceptance of voter registration 14 applications.--15 (5)(a) A voter registration application is complete if 16 17 it contains the following information necessary to establish the applicant's eligibility pursuant to s. 97.041, including: 18 1. The applicant's name. 19 2. The applicant's legal residence address. 20 21 3. The applicant's date of birth. 22 4. A mark in the checkbox affirming that the applicant 23 is a citizen of the United States. 5.a. The applicant's current and valid Florida 2.4 driver's license number or the identification number from a 25 Florida identification card issued under s. 322.051, or 26 27 b. If the applicant has not been issued a current and 2.8 valid Florida driver's license or a Florida identification card, the last four digits of the applicant's social security 29 30 number. 31

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1 In case an applicant has not been issued a current and valid 2 Florida driver's license, Florida identification card, or social security number, the applicant shall affirm this fact 3 in the manner prescribed in the uniform statewide voter 4 5 registration application. б 6. A mark in the checkbox affirming that the applicant 7 has not been convicted of a felony or that, if convicted, has 8 had his or her voting civil rights restored. 9 7. A mark in the checkbox affirming that the applicant has not been adjudicated mentally incapacitated with respect 10 to voting or that, if so adjudicated, has had his or her right 11 12 to vote restored. 13 8. The original signature or a digital signature transmitted by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor 14 Vehicles of the applicant swearing or affirming under the 15 penalty for false swearing pursuant to s. 104.011 that the 16 17 information contained in the registration application is true 18 and subscribing to the oath required by s. 3, Art. VI of the State Constitution and s. 97.051. 19 Section 5. This act shall take effect on the effective 20 date of Senate Joint Resolution ____ or another amendment to 21 the State Constitution which authorizes, or removes 22 23 impediments to, enactment of this act by the Legislature. 2.4 25 SENATE SUMMARY 26 Creates the "Citizens' Empowerment Act." Provides that a convicted felon who is incarcerated or is on probation, 27 2.8 parole, or community control may not vote. Provides for restoration of that right 1 year after completion of the 29 sentence, unless automatic restoration is objected to by a majority of the Board of Executive Clemency. 30 31

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
