Subsection (4) of section 316.0741, Florida 25 Statutes, is amended to read: 26 316.0741 High occupancy vehicle lanes.--27 (4) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, an inherently low-emission vehicle (ILEV) that is certified and 28 Page 1 of 2

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29 labeled in accordance with federal regulations may be driven in 30 an HOV lane at any time, regardless of its occupancy. In 31 addition, upon the state's receipt of written notice from the 32 proper federal regulatory agency authorizing such use, a vehicle defined as a hybrid vehicle under this section may be driven in 33 34 an HOV lane at any time, regardless of its occupancy. The 35 department shall issue a decal and registration certificate, to 36 be renewed annually, reflecting the HOV lane designation on such 37 vehicles authorizing such use. The department may charge a fee 38 for a decal, not to exceed the costs of designing, producing, and distributing each decal, or \$5, whichever is less. The 39 proceeds from sale of the decals shall be deposited in the 40 41 Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund. The department shall add to 42 the list of vehicles eligible to travel in HOV lanes any vehicle 43 with a federal Environmental Protection Agency highway rating of 44 more than 40 miles per gallon but may remove some or all of such 45 vehicles from the list if, in the department's discretion, 46 congestion results in defeating the goal of greater fuel 47 economy. Under such circumstances, the department shall remove 48 from the list the most fuel economical vehicles last. 49 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.

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
