## I. Summary:

The effects of this bill are as follows:

- That portion of State Road A1A (U.S. 1) beginning at its intersection with PGA Boulevard and ending just west of the Burnt Bridge, Florida Department of Transportation bridge number 930361, in Palm Beach County is designated as "Jack Nicklaus Drive."
- The village in which this drive is located is authorized and directed to change street signs and markers, mailing addresses, and 911 emergency telephone number system listings to reflect the changes.

#### II. Present Situation:

Section 276.062 provides: (1) Except as specifically provided by law, no state building, road, bridge, park, recreational complex, or other similar facility shall be named for any living person. (2) The division shall, after consulting with the Florida Historical Commission, recommend several persons whose contributions to the state have been of such significance that the division may recommend that state buildings and facilities be named for them.

Section 334.071, F.S., provides: (1) Legislative designations of transportation facilities are for honorary or memorial purposes, or to distinguish a particular facility, and may not be construed to require any action by local governments or private parties regarding the changing of any street signs, mailing addresses, or 911 emergency telephone number system listings, unless the legislation specifically provides for such changes; (2) When the Legislature establishes road or bridge designations, FDOT is required to place markers only at the termini specified for each highway segment or bridge designated by the law creating the designation, and to erect any other

markers it deems appropriate for the transportation facility; and (3) The FDOT may not erect the markers for honorary road or bridge designations unless the affected city or county commission enacts a resolution supporting the designation. When the designated road or bridge segment is located in more than one city or county, resolutions supporting the designations must be passed by each affected local government prior to the erection of the markers.

The effects of this bill are as follows:

- That portion of State Road A1A (U.S. 1) beginning at its intersection with PGA Boulevard and ending just west of the Burt Bridge, Florida Department of Transportation bridge number 930361, in Palm Beach County is designated as "Jack Nicklaus Drive."
