19	(3) DESIGNATION OF SCHOOL PERFORMANCE GRADE CATEGORIES. $-\underline{A}$
20	school that serves any combination of students in kindergarten
21	through grade 3 that does not receive a school grade because its
22	students are not tested and included in the school grading
23	system shall receive the school grade designation of a feeder
24	pattern school identified by the Department of Education and
25	verified by the school district. A school feeder pattern exists
26	if at least 60 percent of the students in the school serving a
27	combination of students in kindergarten through grade 3 are

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28 scheduled to be assigned to the graded school. School 29 performance grade category designations itemized in subsection (2) shall be based on the following: 30 Timeframes. --31 (a) School performance grade category designations shall be 32 1. based on the school's current year performance and the school's 33 annual learning gains. 34 A school's performance grade category designation shall 35 2. be based on a combination of student achievement scores, student 36 37 learning gains as measured by annual FCAT assessments in grades 3 through 10, and improvement of the lowest 25th percentile of 38 39 students in the school in reading, math, or writing on the FCAT, 40 unless these students are performing above satisfactory 41 performance. Student assessment data.--Student assessment data used 42 (b) 43 in determining school performance grade categories shall include: 44 The aggregate scores of all eligible students enrolled 45 1. 46 in the school who have been assessed on the FCAT. The aggregate scores of all eligible students enrolled 47 2. 48 in the school who have been assessed on the FCAT, including Florida Writes, and who have scored at or in the lowest 25th 49 50 percentile of students in the school in reading, math, or writing, unless these students are performing above satisfactory 51 52 performance. 53

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54 The Department of Education shall study the effects of mobility 55 on the performance of highly mobile students and recommend 56 programs to improve the performance of such students. The State Board of Education shall adopt appropriate criteria for each 57 school performance grade category. The criteria must also give 58 59 added weight to student achievement in reading. Schools designated as performance grade category "C," making 60 satisfactory progress, shall be required to demonstrate that 61 adequate progress has been made by students in the school who 62 are in the lowest 25th percentile in reading, math, or writing 63 on the FCAT, including Florida Writes, unless these students are 64 65 performing above satisfactory performance.

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81 such low performance, and the student's attendance occurred 82 during a school year in which such designation was in effect; 83 2. The student has been in attendance elsewhere in the 84 public school system and has been assigned to such school for 85 the next school year; or 86 3. The student is entering kindergarten or first grade and

a) The student is entering kindergarten or first grade and
has been notified that the student has been assigned to such
school for the next school year.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to a student who 90 is enrolled in a school operating for the purpose of providing 91 92 educational services to youth in Department of Juvenile Justice 93 commitment programs. For purposes of continuity of educational 94 choice, the opportunity scholarship shall remain in force until 95 the student returns to a public school or, if the student 96 chooses to attend a private school the highest grade of which is 97 grade 8, until the student matriculates to high school and the public high school to which the student is assigned is an 98 99 accredited school with a performance grade category designation 100 of "C" or better. However, at any time upon reasonable notice to 101 the Department of Education and the school district, the student's parent may remove the student from the private school 102 103 and place the student in a public school, as provided in 104 subparagraph (3)(a)2.

(3) SCHOOL DISTRICT OBLIGATIONS. --

(a) A school district shall, for each student enrolled in
or assigned to a school, including a K-3 feeder pattern school,

Timely notify the parent of the student as soon as such
 designation is made of all options available pursuant to this

Offer that student's parent an opportunity to enroll the student in the public school within the district that has 114 been designated by the state pursuant to s. 1008.34 as a school 115 116 performing higher than that in which the student is currently enrolled or to which the student has been assigned, but not less 117 than performance grade category "C." The parent is not required 118 to accept this offer in lieu of requesting a state opportunity 119 120 scholarship to a private school. The opportunity to continue attending the higher performing public school shall remain in 121 force until the student graduates from high school. 122

123 (b) The parent of a student enrolled in or assigned to a school, including a K-3 feeder pattern school, that has been 124 designated performance grade category "F" for 2 school years in 125 126 a 4-year period may choose as an alternative to enroll the 127 student in and transport the student to a higher-performing 128 public school that has available space in an adjacent school district, and that school district shall accept the student and 129 130 report the student for purposes of the district's funding 131 pursuant to the Florida Education Finance Program.
