directory the primary purpose of which is to provide products and services at free, reduced, or discounted prices to consumers and in which the statement prominently appears in at least one place. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006. \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* SENATE SUMMARY Removes a requirement that hearing aid specialists provide a disclosure concerning the right to refuse to pay for certain services that are advertised as free, discounted, or reduced.
