A bill to be entitled

An act relating to public records; amending s. 119.071, F.S.; providing an exemption from public records requirements for the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of active or former emergency medical technicians or paramedics certified in compliance with chapter 401, the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and the children of such emergency medical technicians and paramedics, and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by children of such emergency medical technicians and paramedics; providing for future review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section 119.071, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

119.071 General exemptions from inspection or copying of public records.--

(4) AGENCY PERSONNEL INFORMATION. --

(d)1. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of active or former law enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of abuse,

neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal 29 30 activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties 31 are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, and 32 personnel of the Department of Revenue or local governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection and 33 34 enforcement or child support enforcement; the home addresses, 35 telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and 36 places of employment of the spouses and children of such 37 personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care 38 facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, and 39 photographs of firefighters certified in compliance with s. 40 633.35; the home addresses, telephone numbers, photographs, and 41 42 places of employment of the spouses and children of such 43 firefighters; and the names and locations of schools and day 44 care facilities attended by the children of such firefighters are exempt from s. 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone 45 46 numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of active or 47 former emergency medical technicians or paramedics certified in 48 compliance with chapter 401; the home addresses, telephone 49 numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of 50 employment of the spouses and children of such emergency medical technicians and paramedics; and the names and locations of 51 52 schools and day care facilities attended by children of such 53 emergency medical technicians and paramedics are exempt from s. 54 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. The 55 home addresses and telephone numbers of justices of the Supreme 56 Court, district court of appeal judges, circuit court judges,

and county court judges; the home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of justices and judges; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of justices and judges are exempt from s. 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2011, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

2. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former human resource, labor relations, or employee relations directors, assistant directors, managers, or assistant managers of any local government agency or water management district whose duties include hiring and firing employees, labor contract negotiation, administration, or other personnel-related duties; the names,

home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

- 3. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- 4. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district judges, and United States magistrate judges; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of

employment of the spouses and children of current or former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district judges, and United States magistrate judges; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district judges, and United States magistrate judges are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

- 5. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former code enforcement officers; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such persons; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such persons are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- 6. The home addresses, telephone numbers, places of employment, and photographs of current or former guardians ad litem, as defined in s. 39.820, and the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and

children of such persons, are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, if the guardian ad litem provides a written statement that the guardian ad litem has made reasonable efforts to protect such information from being accessible through other means available to the public. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2010, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

7. An agency that is the custodian of the personal information specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., subparagraph 5., or subparagraph 6. and that is not the employer of the officer, employee, justice, judge, or other person specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., subparagraph 5., or subparagraph 6. shall maintain the exempt status of the personal information only if the officer, employee, justice, judge, other person, or employing agency of the designated employee submits a written request for maintenance of the exemption to the custodial agency.

Section 2. The Legislature finds that the exemption from public records requirements provided for by this act for the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of active or former emergency medical technicians or paramedics certified in compliance with chapter 401, Florida Statutes, the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such emergency medical technicians and

paramedics, and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such emergency medical technicians and paramedics is a public necessity. Emergency medical technicians and paramedics, law enforcement officers, and firefighters deal with the same situations and the same individuals in the discharge of their duties, yet law enforcement officers and firefighters are currently granted an exemption from public records requirements with respect to information that identifies and locates them and their spouses and children, and emergency medical technicians and paramedics are not. Emergency medical technicians and paramedics are often exposed to a criminal element when rendering medical treatment, the need for which results from the commission of a criminal act. This exemption is justified, because if the identifying information specified in this act were not made confidential and exempt from public records requirements, an emergency medical technician or paramedic or a member or members of his or her family could be harmed or threatened with harm by an individual or a family member of such individual who was provided emergency medical care which resulted in a negative outcome or who seeks retribution for the emergency medical technician's or paramedic's involvement in the control or management of a crime scene.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
