1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to the social status of black men and boys; creating the Council on the 3 4 Social Status of Black Men and Boys; providing 5 for the appointment and qualification of 6 members; providing for the appointment of 7 members to fill vacant positions; providing for terms of office; requiring the council to make 8 9 a systematic study of conditions affecting 10 black men and boys; requiring the Office of the Attorney General to provide administrative 11 12 support; requiring the council to submit an 13 annual report to the Governor and Legislature; providing for reimbursement for per diem and 14 travel expenses; requiring the Attorney General 15 to organize the initial meeting of the council; 16 17 providing for the expiration of the council; 18 providing an appropriation; providing an effective date. 19 20 21 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 22 23 Section 1. Legislative findings. -- The Legislature finds that there is a chronological record of the status of 2.4 black men and boys in American society, and in this state's 25 society, which reveals startling and disturbing conditions and 26 27 trends. This record includes a disproportionate share of black 2.8 men and boys in this state's correctional facilities; a higher rate of black men and boys being victimized by black-on-black 29 crime; a higher drop-out rate from high school; an average 30

income lower than that of other segments of society, along

1	with a lowering of the income earned; a higher death rate from
2	illness; and a lower life expectancy than males in other
3	ethnic and racial groups.
4	Section 2. <u>Council on the Social Status of Black Men</u>
5	and Boys
6	(1) The Council on the Social Status of Black Men and
7	Boys is established and shall consist of 19 members appointed
8	as follows:
9	(a) Two members of the Senate who are not members of
10	the same political party, appointed by the President of the
11	Senate with the advice of the minority leader of the Senate.
12	(b) Two members of the House of Representatives who
13	are not members of the same political party, appointed by the
14	Speaker of the House of Representatives with the advice of the
15	minority leader of the House of Representatives.
16	(c) The Secretary of Children and Family Services or
17	his or her designee.
18	(d) The director of the Mental Health Program Office
19	within the Department of Children and Family Services or his
20	or her designee.
21	(e) The Secretary of Health or his or her designee.
22	(f) The Commissioner of Education or his or her
23	designee.
24	(q) The Secretary of Corrections or his or her
25	<u>designee.</u>
26	(h) The Attorney General or his or her designee.
27	(i) The Secretary of Management Services or his or her
28	<u>designee.</u>
29	(j) The director of Workforce Innovation or his or her
30	<u>designee.</u>
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1	(k) A business person of African-American origin
2	appointed by the Governor.
3	(1) Two persons appointed by the President of the
4	Senate who are not members of the Legislature or employed by
5	state government. One of the appointments must be a clinical
6	physiologist.
7	(m) Two persons appointed by the Speaker of the House
8	of Representatives who are not members of the Legislature or
9	employed by state government. One of the appointments must be
10	an Africana studies professional.
11	(n) The deputy secretary for Medicaid in the Agency
12	for Health Care Administration or his or her designee.
13	(o) The Secretary of Juvenile Justice or his or her
14	designee.
15	(2) Each member of the council shall be appointed to a
16	4-year term; however, for the purpose of providing staggered
17	terms, of the initial appointments 10 members shall be
18	appointed to 2-year terms and 11 members shall be appointed to
19	4-year terms. A member of the council may be removed at any
20	time by the member's appointing authority, who shall fill the
21	vacancy on the council for the remainder of the unexpired
22	term. The terms of the legislative members expire at the time
23	they cease to hold legislative office, and the vacancy shall
24	be filled in the same manner as the original appointments.
25	(3)(a) At the first meeting of the council each year,
26	the members shall elect a chairperson and a vice chairperson.
27	(b) A vacancy in the office of chairperson or vice
28	chairperson shall be filled by vote of the remaining members.
29	(4)(a) The council shall make a systematic study of
30	the conditions affecting black men and boys, including, but
31	not limited to, the homicide rates, arrest and incarceration

Τ	rates, poverty, violence, drug abuse, death rates, disparate
2	annual income levels, and health issues.
3	(b) The council shall propose measures to alleviate
4	and correct the underlying causes of the conditions described
5	in paragraph (a). These measures may consist of changes to law
6	or systemic changes that can be implemented without
7	legislative actions.
8	(c) The council may study other topics suggested by
9	the Legislature or as directed by the chairperson of the
10	council.
11	(d) The council shall receive suggestions or comments
12	pertinent to the applicable issues from members of the
13	Legislature, governmental agencies, public and private
14	organizations, and private citizens.
15	(5) The Office of the Attorney General shall provide
16	staff and administrative support to the council.
17	(6) The council shall meet quarterly and additional
18	meetings may be held at the call of the chairperson and at
19	other times as determined by a majority of council members.
20	(7) Eleven of the members of the council constitute a
21	quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members
22	present is required for final action.
23	(8)(a) The council shall issue its initial annual
24	report by December 15, 2007, and by December 15th of each
25	following year, stating the findings, conclusions, and
26	recommendations of the council. This report shall be submitted
27	to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of
28	the House of Representatives, and the chairpersons of the
29	standing committees of jurisdiction in each chamber.
30	(b) The initial report must include the findings of an

31 <u>investigation into factors causing black-on-black crime from</u>

1	the perspective of public health related to mental health,
2	other health issues, cultural disconnection, and cultural
3	identity trauma.
4	(9) Members of the council shall serve without
5	compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem
6	and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061, Florida
7	Statutes.
8	(10) Notwithstanding subsection (6), the Attorney
9	General shall:
10	(a) Fix a date for the initial meeting of the council;
11	(b) Notify each member of the council of the time,
12	date, and place where the initial meeting will be held;
13	(c) Make any other arrangements concerning the initial
14	meeting of the council; and
15	(d) Serve as the presiding officer at the initial
16	meeting of the council until a chairperson is elected.
17	(11) This section expires July 1, 2012, unless
18	reenacted by the Legislature.
19	Section 3. A sum of \$50,000 is appropriated from the
20	General Revenue Fund for the Council on the Social Status of
21	Black Men and Boys.
22	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
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25	SENATE SUMMARY
26	Creates the Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys to study the conditions affecting black men and boys
27	and to issue an annual report. Provides for the Office of
28	the Attorney General to provide administrative support. Provides for the council to expire on July 1, 2012.
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
