5 (c) (1) Funding for a high quality public K-12 education
6 through classroom instruction is fundamental. To make adequate
7 provision for a high quality public K-12 education, at least
8 sixty-five percent of school funding received by school
9 districts shall be spent on classroom instruction, rather than
10 on administration. Classroom instruction and administration
11 shall be defined by law.

12 (2) At a minimum, classroom instruction means: salaries
13 and benefits for teachers and paraprofessionals; costs for
14 instructional materials and supplies; costs associated with
15 classroom-related activities that include field trips,
16 athletics, music, and arts; tuition paid to out-of-state school
