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16	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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18	Section 1. Section 1003.429, Florida Statutes, is
19	amended to read:
20	1003.429 Accelerated high school graduation options
21	(1) Students who enter grade 9 in the <u>2006-2007</u>
22	<del>2004 2005</del> school year and thereafter may select <u>, upon receipt</u>
23	of each consent required by this section, one of the following
24	two three high school graduation options:
25	(a) Completion of the general requirements for high
26	school graduation pursuant to s. 1003.43; or
27	(b) Completion of a 3-year standard college
28	preparatory program requiring successful completion of a
29	minimum of 18 academic credits in grades 9 through 12. At
30	least 6 of the 18 credits required for completion of this
31	program must be received in classes that are <u>offered pursuant</u>
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1 to the International Baccalaureate Program administered by the 2 International Baccalaureate Office or the Advanced Placement Program administered by the College Board honors, dual 3 4 enrollment, advanced placement, International Baccalaureate, Advanced International Certificate of Education, specifically 5 б listed or identified by the Department of Education as 7 rigorous pursuant to s. 1009.531(3), or weighted by the 8 district school board for class ranking purposes. The 18 credits required for completion of this program shall be 9 10 primary requirements and shall be distributed as follows: 1. Four credits in English, with major concentration 11 12 in composition and literature; 13 2. Three credits in mathematics at the Algebra I level or higher from the list of courses that qualify for state 14 university admission; 15 3. Three credits in natural science, two of which must 16 17 have a laboratory component; 4. Three credits in social sciences, which must 18 include one credit in American history, one credit in world 19 history, one-half credit in American government, and one-half 20 21 credit in economics; 22 5. Two credits in the same second language unless the 23 student is a native speaker of or can otherwise demonstrate competency in a language other than English. If the student 2.4 demonstrates competency in another language, the student may 25 replace the language requirement with two credits in other 26 27 academic courses; and 28 6. Three credits in electives. - or 29 (c) Completion of a 3 year career preparatory program 30 successful completion of a minimum of 18 academic requiring 31

credits in grades 9 through 12. The 18 credits shall be 1 2 primary requirements and shall be distributed as follows: 3 Four credits in English, with major concentration 4 in composition and literature; 5 Three credits in mathematics, one of which must be 2 б Algebra I; 7 3. Three credits in natural science, two of which must 8 have a laboratory component; 9 4. Three credits in social sciences, which must 10 include one credit in American history, one credit in world history, one half credit in American government, and one half 11 12 credit in economics; 13 5. Three credits in a single vocational or career 14 education program, three credits in career and technical certificate dual enrollment courses, or five credits in 15 vocational or career education courses; and 16 17 6. Two credits in electives unless five credits are 18 earned pursuant to subparagraph 5. 19 Any student who selected an accelerated graduation program 20 21 before July 1, 2004, may continue that program, and all 22 statutory program requirements that were applicable when the 23 student made the program choice shall remain applicable to the student as long as the student continues that program. 2.4 25 (2) Prior to selecting a program described in 26 paragraph (1)(b) or paragraph (1)(c), a student and the 27 student's parent must meet with designated school personnel to 28 receive an explanation of the relative requirements, advantages, and disadvantages of each program option, and the 29 30 student must also receive the written consent of the student's 31

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1 high school principal, high school guidance counselor, and 2 parent. the following requirements must be met: (a) Designated school personnel shall meet with the 3 4 student and student's parent to give an explanation of the 5 relative requirements, advantages, and disadvantages of each 6 graduation option. 7 (b) The student shall submit to the high school 8 principal and guidance counselor a signed parental consent 9 enter the 3 year accelerated graduation program. 10 (c) The student shall have achieved at least an FCAT reading achievement level of 3, an FCAT mathematics 11 12 achievement level of 3, and an FCAT Writing score of 3 on the 13 most recent assessments taken by the student. (3) Beginning with the 2006-2007 2004 2005 school 14 year, each district school board shall provide each student in 15 grades 6 through 9 and their parents with information 16 17 concerning the 3-year and 4-year high school graduation 18 options listed in subsection (1), including the respective curriculum requirements for those options, so that the 19 students and their parents may select the program 20 21 postsecondary education or career plan that best fits their 2.2 needs. The information must shall include a timeframe for 23 achieving each graduation option. (4) Selection of one of the graduation options listed 2.4 in subsection (1) must be completed by the student prior to 25 the end of grade 9 and is exclusively up to the student and 26 27 parent, subject to the requirements in subsection (2). Each 2.8 district school board shall establish policies for extending this deadline to the end of a student's first semester of 29 grade 10 for a student who entered a Florida public school 30 after grade 9 upon transfer from a private school or another 31

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1 state or who was prevented from choosing a graduation option 2 due to illness during grade 9. If the student and parent fail to select a graduation option, the student shall be considered 3 to have selected the general requirements for high school 4 graduation pursuant to paragraph (1)(a). 5 б (5) District school boards may shall not establish 7 requirements for the accelerated 3-year high school graduation 8 option options in excess of the requirements in paragraph 9 paragraphs (1)(b) and (c). 10 (6) Students pursuing the accelerated 3-year high school graduation option options pursuant to paragraph (1)(b) 11 12 or paragraph (1)(c) are required to: 13 (a) Earn passing scores on the FCAT as defined in s. 1008.22(3)(c) or scores on a standardized test that are 14 concordant with passing scores on the FCAT as defined in s. 15 1008.22(9). 16 17 (b)1. Achieve a cumulative weighted grade point 18 average of 3.5 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the courses required for the college preparatory accelerated 19 3-year standard college preparatory program under high school 20 21 graduation option pursuant to paragraph (1)(b); and or 22 Receive a grade no lower than a "B" or its 2. 23 equivalent, representing at least 3.0 points on a 4.0 scale, in any course taken in connection with the accelerated 3-year 2.4 standard college preparatory program under paragraph (1)(b). 25 If any student participating in the accelerated 3-year 26 27 standard college preparatory program does not meet this 2.8 requirement, the student shall be required to complete the general requirements for high school graduation pursuant to s. 29 30 1003.43. 31

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(7) A student who selects the accelerated 3-year		
standard college preparatory graduation program may change at		
any time to the 4-year program set forth in s. 1003.43.		
(8) If, at the end of the 10th grade, a student is not		
on track to meet the course, testing, grade, or		
grade-point-average requirements of the accelerated graduation		
option, the student shall default to the standard 4-year		
graduation option.

requirements of the accelerated graduation option selected, 31

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   the school shall notify the student and parent of the
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    following:
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          (a) The requirements that the student is not currently
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   meeting.
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          (b) The specific performance necessary in grade 11 for
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    the student to meet the accelerated graduation requirements.
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          (c) The right of the student to change to the 4 year
   program set forth in s. 1003.43.
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          (8) A student who selected one of the accelerated
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    3 year graduation options shall automatically move to the
    4 year program set forth in s. 1003.43 if the student:
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          (a) Exercises his or her right to change to the 4 year

          (b) Fails to earn 5 credits by the end of grade 9 or
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    fails to earn 11 credits by the end of grade 10;
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          (c) Does not achieve a score of 3 or higher on the
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    grade 10 FCAT Writing assessment; or
          (d) By the end of grade 11 does not meet the
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    requirements of subsections (1) and (6).
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           (9) A student who meets all requirements prescribed in
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    subsections (1) and (6) shall be awarded a standard diploma in
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    a form prescribed by the State Board of Education.
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          (10) A student who seeks academic graduation honors,
    such as being named valedictorian or salutatorian of a high
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    school graduating class, must select the option set forth in
    paragraph (1)(a) and complete the general requirements for
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   high school graduation pursuant to s. 1003.43.
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           Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
