30	(1) The commission shall consist of seven members, all of
31	whom shall be appointed by the Governor, in accordance with the
32	requirements of s. 20.052.
33	(a) Five of the members must have significant experience
34	in the operation of a business and it is the intent of the
35	Legislature that, when making an appointment, the Governor
36	select persons who reflect the broad diversity of the business
37	community in this state, as well as the racial, ethnic,
38	geographical, and gender diversity of the population of this
39	state.
40	(b) Two of the members must have a disability and use the

118	have a minimum of 5 years of continuous experience operating a

121	including dispatch and scheduling responsibilities. Such persons
122	shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture to serve a
123	term of 4 years.
124	(p) Four representatives of current private for-profit or
125	private not for profit transportation operators, each of which
126	having a minimum of 5 years of continuous experience operating a
127	broad-based system of ambulatory and wheelchair or stretcher-
128	type transportation, utilizing not less than 50 vehicles, and
129	including dispatch and scheduling responsibilities. Such persons
130	shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture to serve a
131	term of 4 years.
132	(q) Six citizens representing the nontransportation
133	business community of the state, three members appointed by the

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134 President of the Senate and three members appointed by the 135 Speaker of the House of Representatives. The chairperson shall be appointed by the Governor and 136 (2)the vice chairperson of the commission shall be elected annually 137 from the membership of the commission. 138 139 (3) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but shall be allowed per diem and travel expenses, 140 141 as provided in s. 112.061. 142 (4) The commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the call of the chairperson. Five Nine members of 143 the commission constitute a quorum, and a majority vote of the 144 members present is necessary for any action taken by the 145 146 commission. 147 (5) The Governor may remove any member of the commission for cause. 148 Each candidate for appointment to the commission must, 149 (6) before accepting the appointment, undergo background screening 150 under s. 435.04 by filing with the Department of Transportation 151 152 a complete set of fingerprints taken by an authorized law enforcement agency. The fingerprints must be submitted to the 153 154 Department of Law Enforcement for state processing, and that 155 department shall submit the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau 156 of Investigation for federal processing. The Department of Transportation shall screen the background results and inform 157 the commission of any candidate who does not meet level 2 158 159 screening standards. A candidate who has not met level 2 160 screening standards may not be appointed to the commission. The

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161 cost of the background screening may be borne by the Department162 of Transportation or the candidate.

163 <u>(7)(6)</u> The commission shall appoint an executive director 164 who shall serve under the direction, supervision, and control of 165 the commission. The executive director, with the consent of the 166 commission, shall employ such personnel as may be necessary to 167 perform adequately the functions of the commission within 168 budgetary limitations. All Employees of the commission are 169 exempt from the Career Service System.

The commission shall appoint a technical working group 170 (8) that includes representatives of private paratransit providers. 171 172 The technical working group shall advise the commission on 173 issues of importance to the state, including information, 174advice, and direction regarding the coordination of services for 175 the transportation disadvantaged. The commission may appoint 176 other technical working groups whose members may include 177 representatives of community transportation coordinators; metropolitan planning organizations; regional planning councils; 178 experts in insurance, marketing, economic development, or 179 180 financial planning; and persons who use transportation for the transportation disadvantaged, or their relatives, parents, 181 182 quardians, or service professionals who tend to their needs.

183 <u>(9)</u>(7) The commission is assigned to the office of the 184 secretary of the Department of Transportation for administrative 185 and fiscal accountability purposes, but it shall otherwise 186 function independently of the control, supervision, and 187 direction of the department.

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188	(10) (8) The commission shall develop a budget pursuant to
189	chapter 216. The budget is not subject to change by the
190	department staff after it has been approved by the commission,
191	but it shall be transmitted to the Governor, as head of the
192	department, along with the budget of the department.
193	Section 2. Subsection (28) is added to section 427.013,
194	Florida Statutes, to read:
195	427.013 The Commission for the Transportation
196	Disadvantaged; purpose and responsibilitiesThe purpose of the
197	commission is to accomplish the coordination of transportation
198	services provided to the transportation disadvantaged. The goal
199	of this coordination shall be to assure the cost-effective
200	provision of transportation by qualified community
201	transportation coordinators or transportation operators for the
202	transportation disadvantaged without any bias or presumption in
203	favor of multioperator systems or not-for-profit transportation
204	operators over single operator systems or for-profit
205	transportation operators. In carrying out this purpose, the
206	commission shall:
207	(28) In consultation with the Agency for Health Care
208	Administration and the Department of Transportation, develop an
209	allocation methodology that equitably distributes all
210	transportation funds under the control of the commission to
211	compensate counties, community transportation coordinators, and
212	other entities providing transportation disadvantaged services.
213	The methodology shall separately account for Medicaid
214	beneficiaries. The methodology shall consider such factors as
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215	the actual costs of each transportation disadvantaged trip based
216	on prior-year information, efficiencies that a provider might
217	adopt to reduce costs, results of the rate and cost comparisons
218	conducted under subsections (24) and (25), as well as cost
219	efficiencies of trips when compared to the local cost of
220	transporting the general public. This subsection does not
221	supersede the authority of the Agency for Health Care
222	Administration to distribute Medicaid funds.
