Subsections (2), (7), (25), (27), and (28) of section 489.505, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 27 489.505 Definitions.--As used in this part: 28 29 (2)"Alarm system contractor" means a person whose business includes the execution of contracts requiring the 30 31 ability, experience, science, knowledge, and skill to lay out, 32 fabricate, install, maintain, alter, repair, monitor, inspect, 33 replace, or service alarm systems for compensation, including, 34 but not limited to, all types of alarm systems for all purposes. The term also means any person, firm, or corporation that 35 36 engages in the business of alarm system contracting under an expressed or implied contract; that undertakes, offers to 37 38 undertake, purports to have the capacity to undertake, or 39 submits a bid to engage in the business of alarm system 40 contracting; or that does, itself or by or through others, engage in the business of alarm system contracting. 41 42 (a) "Alarm system contractor I" means an alarm system 43 contractor whose business includes all types of alarm systems 44 for all purposes. 45 (b) "Alarm system contractor II" means an alarm system contractor whose business includes all types of alarm systems 46 47 other than fire, for all purposes, except as herein provided. 48 (7)

(7) "Certified alarm system contractor" means an alarm
system contractor who possesses a certificate of competency
issued by the department. The scope of certification is limited
to alarm circuits originating in the alarm control panel and
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equipment governed by the applicable provisions of Articles 725, 52 760, 770, 800, and 810 of the National Electrical Code, Current 53 54 Edition, and National Fire Protection Association Standard 72, 55 Current Edition. The scope of certification for alarm system contractors also includes the installation, repair, fabrication, 56 57 erection, alteration, addition, inspection, monitoring, or design of electrical wiring, fixtures, appliances, thermostats, 58 59 apparatus, raceways, and conduit, or any part thereof not to 60 exceed 98 volts (RMS) 77 volts, when those items are for the 61 purpose of transmitting data or proprietary video (satellite 62 systems that are not part of a community antenna television or radio distribution system) or providing central vacuum 63 64 capability or electric locks; however, this provision governing the scope of certification does not create any mandatory 65 66 licensure requirement.

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(25) "Burglar alarm system agent" means a person:

(a) Who is employed by a licensed alarm system contractoror licensed electrical contractor;

(b) Who is performing duties which are an element of an
activity which constitutes alarm system contracting requiring
licensure under this part; and

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call made to the premises generating the alarm signal, prior to 136 alarm monitor personnel contacting a law enforcement agency for 137 138 alarm dispatch. The central monitoring station must employ enhanced call verification methods for the premises generating 139 140 the alarm signal if the first call is not answered. However, if 141 the intrusion/burglary alarms have properly operating visual or auditory sensors that enable the monitoring personnel to verify 142 the alarm signal, verification calling is not required. 143 Section 5. Section 489.530, Florida Statutes, is amended 144 to read: 145 489.530 Audible alarms. -- Every audible alarm system 146 installed by a licensed contractor shall have a device to 147 148 automatically terminate the audible signal within 15 minutes of activation. Fire alarms systems, whether installed voluntarily 149 150 or as a requirement of an adopted code employing audible fire 151 signals, shall be exempted as required by such code. 152 Section 6.
