1 The Health Care General Committee recommends the following: 2 3 Council/Committee Substitute Remove the entire bill and insert: 4 A bill to be entitled 5 6 An act relating to routinely recommended childhood 7 vaccines; requiring the University of Miami, in conjunction with regional autism centers, to conduct a 8 study; providing the goal of the study; providing for 9 10 consultation with other schools; requiring a report to the Governor and the Legislature; requiring the Department of 11 Health to prepare a notice to be displayed in specified 12 locations where routinely recommended childhood vaccines 13 14 are administered to children in a specified age group; specifying contents of the notice; requiring certain 15 health care practitioners that administer such vaccines to 16 17 post the notice; providing an effective date. 18 19 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 20 21 Section 1. Autism study.--The University of Miami, in 22 conjunction with the regional autism centers established under 23 s. 1004.55, Florida Statutes, shall conduct an autism Page 1 of 3

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24 epidemiology study and a review of the current published 25 scientific literature relating to autism. The goal of the study is to gain a better understanding of the prevalence of autism in 26 27 the state; the unique demographic characteristics of the autistic population; the role that family history plays in the 28 29 development of autism; the effect of routinely recommended childhood vaccines containing the preservative thimerosal, other 30 environmental exposure to mercury, and exposure to other toxic 31 chemicals on children; and other factors that may have an impact 32 33 on the development of autism in children. The university may consult with other Florida university medical schools and 34 colleges or schools of pharmacy in conducting this study. The 35 36 university shall submit a report of its findings to the 37 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker the House 38 of Representatives by October 1, 2007. 39 Section 2. Department of Health; administration of 40 routinely recommended childhood vaccines; notice. -- The Department of Health shall prepare a notice for display by all 41 42 health care practitioners as defined in s. 456.001(4), Florida Statutes, who administer routinely recommended childhood 43 vaccines to children under 3 years of age. The notice shall be 44 45 written in simple language so that it is easily understandable by the general population. The notice shall be made available in 46 47 both English and Spanish and shall contain, at a minimum: A statement indicating that childhood vaccines 48 (1)49 routinely recommended by health care practitioners may contain 50 thimerosal, a preservative that contains mercury.

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51 (2) A statement declaring the official position of the 52 United States Public Health Service on the presence of thimerosal in routinely recommended childhood vaccines. 53 54 (3) The Internet website address of the Department of 55 Health pertaining to routinely recommended childhood vaccines 56 and immunizations. 57 The Internet website addresses of the Centers for (4)Disease Control and Prevention and the National Institutes of 58 59 Health pertaining to the most current scientific information regarding the use of thimerosal in routinely recommended 60 61 childhood vaccines. Section 3. Notice to the public. -- A health care 62 63 practitioner as defined in s. 456.001(4), Florida Statutes, who administers routinely recommended childhood vaccines to children 64 under 3 years of age shall display in the office or location 65 where the vaccinations take place a notice prepared by the 66 67 Department of Health containing specific information regarding vaccines pursuant to section 2. The notice shall be displayed in 68 69 a location conspicuous to the public or as required by the 70 department. Section 4. This act shall take effect January 1, 2007. 71

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
