Subsection (33) is added to section 212.02, 18 19 Florida Statutes, to read: 212.02 Definitions.--The following terms and phrases when 20 used in this chapter have the meanings ascribed to them in this 21 22 section, except where the context clearly indicates a different 23 meaning: Page 1 of 3

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24	(33) "Low-volume irrigation" or "microirrigation" means
25	irrigation by means of frequent application of small quantities
26	of water directly on or below the soil surface, usually as
27	discrete drops, tiny streams, or miniature sprays through
28	emitters placed along the water delivery pipes. Low-volume
29	irrigation and microirrigation systems are designed to deliver
30	water at a rate of 45 gallons per hour or less per exit point.
31	The physical components required to apply water by low-volume
32	irrigation or microirrigation methods include all equipment and
33	system components necessary to transport water from the pump or
34	pumping station to the crop through the low-volume irrigation or
35	microirrigation system. System components include pumps, pumping
36	stations, control stations, filtration equipment pressure
37	regulators, piping, tubing, emitters, valves, fittings, gauges,
38	sensors, sprinklers, and safety devices.
39	Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section
40	212.08, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
41	212.08 Sales, rental, use, consumption, distribution, and
42	storage tax; specified exemptionsThe sale at retail, the
43	rental, the use, the consumption, the distribution, and the
44	storage to be used or consumed in this state of the following
45	are hereby specifically exempt from the tax imposed by this

47	(5) EXEMPTIONS; ACCOUNT OF USE
48	(a) Items in agricultural use and certain netsThere are
49	exempt from the tax imposed by this chapter nets designed and
50	used exclusively by commercial fisheries; disinfectants,

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and weed killers used for application on crops or groves, including commercial nurseries and home vegetable gardens, used in dairy barns or on poultry farms for the purpose of protecting poultry or livestock, or used directly on poultry or livestock; portable containers or movable receptacles in which portable containers are placed, used for processing farm products; field and garden seeds, including flower seeds; nursery stock, seedlings, cuttings, or other propagative material purchased for growing stock; seeds, seedlings, cuttings, and plants used to produce food for human consumption; cloth, plastic, and other similar materials used for shade, mulch, or protection from frost or insects on a farm; <u>and low-volume irrigation or</u> microirrigation equipment or components, as defined in s.

65 212.02(33), used in agricultural production generators used on poultry farms; and liquefied petroleum gas or other fuel used to 66 67 heat a structure in which started pullets or broilers are raised; however, such exemption shall not be allowed unless the 68 69 purchaser or lessee signs a certificate stating that the item to 70 be exempted is for the exclusive use designated herein. Also exempt are cellophane wrappers, glue for tin and glass 71 (apiarists), mailing cases for honey, shipping cases, window 72 73 cartons, and baling wire and twine used for baling hay, when used by a farmer to contain, produce, or process an agricultural 74 75 commodity.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.

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
