HB 517 2006

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to nonprofit organization self-insurance funds; creating s. 624.4624, F.S.; authorizing two or more nonprofit organizations to form a self-insurance fund for certain purposes; providing specific requirements; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 624.4624, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

624.4624 Nonprofit organization self-insurance funds.--

- (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any two or more nonprofit organizations located in and organized under the laws of this state may form a self-insurance fund for the purpose of pooling and spreading liabilities of its group members in any property or casualty risk or surety insurance or securing the payment of benefits under chapter 440, provided the nonprofit organization self-insurance fund that is created:
  - (a) Has annual normal premiums in excess of \$5 million.
- (b) Requires for qualification that each participating member receive at least 75 percent of its revenues from local, state, or federal governmental sources.
- (c) Maintains a continuing program of excess insurance coverage and reserve evaluation to protect the financial stability of the fund in an amount and manner determined by a qualified, independent actuary.

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(d) Submits to the office annually an audited fiscal yearend financial statement by an independent certified public accountant within 6 months after the end of the fiscal year.

(e) Has a governing body which is comprised entirely of nonprofit organization officials.

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- (2) A nonprofit organization self-insurance fund that meets the requirements of this section is not subject to s. 624.4621 and is not required to file any report with the department under s. 440.38(2)(b) which is uniquely required of group self-insurer funds qualified under s. 624.4621. If any of the requirements of this section are not met, the nonprofit organization self-insurance fund is subject to the requirements of s. 624.4621.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
