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Amendment No. (for drafter's use only) 17 (a) The behaviors prompting the evaluation could be the result of underlying physical conditions including but not 18 limited to one or more of the following: poor nutrition; 19 exposure to toxins, including, but not limited to, lead, 20 mercury, pesticides, and other neurotoxins; allergies; seizure 21 disorders; thyroid imbalances; or sleep deprivation. 22 (b) The parent may want to consider consulting a medical 23 doctor to rule out physical causes before pursuing psychological 24 25 or psychiatric evaluation for his or her child. (c) Psychological and psychiatric evaluation and diagnosis 26 27 of mental and behavioral disorders are based on subjective interpretation and not on objective medical tests or physical 28 markers, such as blood tests, brain scans, or X rays. 29 (d) Recommended treatment for emotional, behavioral, or 30 mental disorders may include psychotropic medications that may 31 have potential dangerous side effects, including suicidal and 32 psychotic behavior and other side effects listed in the package 33 insert currently approved by the United States Food and Drug 34 Administration for the medication. 35 There are alternative interventions for mental and 36 (e) behavioral disorders that do not include psychotropic 37 38 medications which the parent has the right to consider and use.
