Subsection (5) of section 1009.972, Florida 7 Statutes, is amended to read: 1009.972 Florida Prepaid College Trust Fund .--8 9 (5) Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 717, funds associated with terminated advance payment contracts 10 pursuant to s. 1009.98(4)(k) and canceled contracts for which 11 12 no refunds have been claimed shall be retained by the board. 13 The board shall establish procedures for notifying purchasers who subsequently cancel their advance payment contracts of any 14 unclaimed refund and shall establish a time period after which 15 no refund may be claimed by a purchaser who canceled a 16 17 contract. Any advertisement disseminated by an 8 eligible for-profit independent college or university which 9 refers to the Florida Prepaid College Program must clearly 10 state: "While the benefits of a Florida Prepaid College 11 12 contract may be used at this institution, the Florida Prepaid 13 College Board does not endorse any particular college or <u>university."</u> 14 15 The board shall transfer or cause to be transferred to the 16 17 institution designated by the qualified beneficiary an amount not to exceed the redemption value of the advance payment 18 contract at a state postsecondary institution. If the cost of 19 registration or housing fees at such institution is less than 20 21 the corresponding fees at a state postsecondary institution, 22 the amount transferred may not exceed the actual cost of 23 registration and housing fees. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006. 7 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN 8 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR 9 CS for Senate Bill 550 10 CS/CS/SB 550 gives authority to approve additional scholarship 11 programs to the Prepaid College Board rather than both the 12 board and the direct support organization. It claries that only private, rather than state funds, shall be used to match the additional scholarships authorized.
