A bill to be entitled

An act relating to police pursuits of fleeing vehicles; requiring the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission to establish a model policy governing the pursuit of fleeing vehicles by law enforcement officers; establishing model policy guidelines; requiring state and local law enforcement agencies to adopt policies for vehicle pursuits; requiring officer training in vehiclepursuit policies; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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(1) By July 1, 2007, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission within the Department of Law Enforcement shall adopt a model policy governing the conduct of law enforcement officers who are pursuing a vehicle that is fleeing a law enforcement officer. The commission shall consider comments from the public when adopting the policy. The model policy shall, at a minimum, contain the following components:

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A statement describing that the philosophy of the model policy is that the safety of persons affected by a vehicle pursuit is of primary importance. It must also balance the risks of a vehicle pursuit to the public and law enforcement officers with the consequences of the failure to pursue such vehicle.

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The factors to consider before initiating or (b) terminating a vehicle pursuit and the standards for determining whether to initiate or terminate a vehicle pursuit.

(c) The procedures, tactics, and technologies used during vehicle pursuits.

- (d) The responsibilities of the pursuing officers, the officers supervising the pursuit, the dispatcher, and air support personnel.
  - (e) The procedures governing interjurisdictional pursuits.
- (f) The procedures governing the care of any person injured during the pursuit.
  - (g) The contents of pursuit reports.

- (h) The procedures used to evaluate each pursuit.
- (2) Each state and local law enforcement agency must:
- (a) Establish a written policy governing the conduct of the agency's law enforcement officers who pursue a fleeing vehicle. The policy must, at a minimum, comply with the requirements of the model pursuit policy adopted by the commission and must consider the public comments and any technology for pursuit vehicles which is available.
- (b) Certify annually to the commission that it has adopted a written policy in compliance with the model pursuit policy.
- (3) The board shall assist each state and local law enforcement agency in developing and implementing pursuit policies.
- (4) (a) By July 1, 2007, the commission shall prepare learning objectives for instructing law enforcement officers in emergency vehicle operations and in the conduct of vehicle pursuits. The course shall consist of at least 7 hours of classroom and skills-based training.
  - (b) A person who has not received the training required by

this section may not take any examination for licensure as a law enforcement officer on or after July 1, 2007.

- (5) Each state and local law enforcement agency shall provide in-service training in emergency vehicle operations and in the conduct of vehicle pursuits to all law enforcement officers employed by the agency who may be involved in a vehicle pursuit, based on the officers' responsibilities. The training must comply with learning objectives approved by the commission and shall consist of at least 8 hours of classroom and skills-based training every 3 years.
- (6) The commission may impose licensing sanctions and seek injunctive relief for the failure of an agency to comply with the requirements of this act.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
