24	(d)1. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social
25	security numbers, and photographs of active or former law
26	enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional

29	abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal
30	activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties

and personnel of the Department of Revenue or local 2 governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home 3 addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 4 5 photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of 7 schools and day care facilities attended by the children of 8 such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of firefighters 9 certified in compliance with s. 633.35; the home addresses, 10 telephone numbers, photographs, and places of employment of 11 12 the spouses and children of such firefighters; and the names 13 and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such firefighters are exempt from s. 14 119.07(1). The home addresses and telephone numbers of 15 justices of the Supreme Court, district court of appeal 16 17 judges, circuit court judges, and county court judges; the 18 home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of justices and judges; and the names 19 and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by 20 21 the children of justices and judges are exempt from s. 22 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 23 security numbers, and photographs of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, 2.4 25 or assistant statewide prosecutors; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and 26 27 places of employment of the spouses and children of current or 2.8 former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide 29 prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by 30 the children of current or former state attorneys, assistant

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state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution.

The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former human resource, labor relations, or employee relations directors, assistant directors, managers, or assistant managers of any local government agency or water management district whose duties include hiring and firing employees, labor contract negotiation, administration, or other personnel-related duties; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- 3. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject

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to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

- 4. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district judges, and United States magistrate judges; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of current or former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district judges, and United States magistrate judges; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district judges, and United States magistrate judges are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- 5. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former code enforcement officers; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such persons; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such persons are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on

October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

- employment, and photographs of current or former guardians ad litem, as defined in s. 39.820, and the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such persons, are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, if the guardian ad litem provides a written statement that the guardian ad litem has made reasonable efforts to protect such information from being accessible through other means available to the public. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2010, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- 7. An agency that is the custodian of the personal information specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., subparagraph 5., or subparagraph 6. and that is not the employer of the officer, employee, justice, judge, or other person specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., subparagraph 5., or subparagraph 6. shall maintain the exempt status of the personal information only if the officer, employee, justice, judge, other person, or employing agency of the designated employee submits a written request for maintenance of the exemption to the custodial agency.

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2006.
