8 (5) (a) Each county health department shall develop,
9 jointly with the district school board and the local school
10 health advisory committee, a school health services plan; and
11 the plan must ~~shall~~ include, at a minimum, provisions for:

12 1. ~~(a)~~ Health appraisal;

13 2. ~~(b)~~ Records review;

14 3. ~~(c)~~ Nurse assessment;

15 4. ~~(d)~~ Nutrition assessment;

16 5. ~~(e)~~ A preventive dental program;

17 6. ~~(f)~~ Vision screening;

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- 18 7.~~(g)~~ Hearing screening;
- 19 8.~~(h)~~ Scoliosis screening;
- 20 9.~~(i)~~ Growth and development screening;
- 21 10.~~(j)~~ Health counseling;
- 22 11.~~(k)~~ Referral and followup of suspected or confirmed
23 health problems by the local county health department;
- 24 12.~~(l)~~ Meeting emergency health needs in each school;
- 25 13.~~(m)~~ County health department personnel to assist school
26 personnel in health education curriculum development;
- 27 14.~~(n)~~ Referral of students to appropriate health
28 treatment, in cooperation with the private health community
29 whenever possible;
- 30 15.~~(o)~~ Consultation with a student's parent or guardian
31 regarding the need for health attention by the family physician,
32 dentist, or other specialist when definitive diagnosis or
33 treatment is indicated;

35 problems, corrective measures taken, and such other information
36 as may be needed to plan and evaluate health programs; except,
37 however, that provisions in the plan for maintenance of health

- 40 17.~~(q)~~ Health information which will be provided by the
41 school health nurses, when necessary, regarding the placement of
42 students in exceptional student programs and the reevaluation at
43 periodic intervals of students placed in such programs; and
- 44 18.~~(r)~~ Notification to the local nonpublic schools of the
45 school health services program and the opportunity for

47 | the development of the cooperative health services plan.

48 | (b) Each school health advisory committee must, at a
49 | minimum, include members who represent the eight component areas
50 | of the Coordinated School Health model as defined by the Centers
51 | for Disease Control and Prevention. School health advisory
52 | committees are encouraged to address the eight components of the
53 | Coordinated School Health model in the school district's school
54 | wellness policy pursuant to s. 1003.453.

55 | (6) A nonpublic school may request to participate in the
56 | school health services program. A nonpublic school voluntarily
57 | participating in the school health services program shall:

58 | (a) Cooperate with the county health department and
59 | district school board in the development of the cooperative
60 | health services plan;

61 | (b) Make available adequate physical facilities for health
62 | services;

63 | (c) Provide inservice health training to school personnel;

64 | (d) Cooperate with public health personnel in the
65 | implementation of the school health services plan;

66 | (e) Be subject to health service program reviews by the
67 | Department of Health and the Department of Education; ~~and~~

68 | (f) At the beginning of each school year, provide parents
69 | and guardians with information concerning ways that they can
70 | help their children to be physically active and to eat healthful
71 | foods; and

72 | (g) ~~(f)~~ At the beginning of each school year, inform
73 | parents or guardians in writing that their children who are
74 | students in the school will receive specified health services as
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75 provided for in the district health services plan. A student
76 will be exempt from any of these services if his or her parent
77 or guardian requests such exemption in writing. This paragraph
78 shall not be construed to authorize invasive screening; if there
79 is a need for such procedure, the consent of the student's
80 parent or guardian shall be obtained in writing prior to
81 performing the screening. However, the laws and rules relating
82 to contagious or communicable diseases and sanitary matters
83 shall not be violated.

84 (7) The district school board shall:

85 (a) Include health services and health education as part
86 of the comprehensive plan for the school district;

87 (b) Provide inservice health training for school
88 personnel;

89 (c) Make available adequate physical facilities for health
90 services; and

91 (d) At the beginning of each school year, provide parents
92 and guardians with information concerning ways that they can
93 help their children to be physically active and to eat healthful
94 foods; and

95 (e)-~~(d)~~ At the beginning of each school year, inform
96 parents or guardians in writing that their children who are
97 students in the district schools will receive specified health
98 services as provided for in the district health services plan. A
99 student will be exempt from any of these services if his or her
100 parent or guardian requests such exemption in writing. This
101 paragraph shall not be construed to authorize invasive
102 screening; if there is a need for such procedure, the consent of
103 the student's parent or guardian shall be obtained in writing

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104 prior to performing the screening. However, the laws and rules
105 relating to contagious or communicable diseases and sanitary
106 matters shall not be violated.
