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18	Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section
19	119.071, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

22	(4) AGENCY PERSONNEL INFORMATION
23	(d)1. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social
24	security numbers, and photographs of active or former law
25	enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional
26	probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children
27	and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of
28	abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal
29	activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties
30	are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect,
31	and personnel of the Department of Revenue or local
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1 governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection 2 and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 3 photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and 4 children of such personnel; and the names and locations of 5 6 schools and day care facilities attended by the children of 7 such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1). The home 8 addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of firefighters certified in compliance with s. 633.35; the home addresses, 9 telephone numbers, photographs, and places of employment of 10 the spouses and children of such firefighters; and the names 11 12 and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by 13 the children of such firefighters are exempt from s. 119.07(1). The home addresses and telephone numbers of 14 justices of the Supreme Court, district court of appeal 15 judges, circuit court judges, and county court judges; the 16 17 home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of 18 the spouses and children of justices and judges; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by 19 the children of justices and judges are exempt from s. 20 21 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 22 security numbers, and photographs of current or former state 23 attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; the home addresses, 2.4 25 telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and 26 places of employment of the spouses and children of current or 27 former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide 2.8 prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; and the names 29 and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former state attorneys, assistant 30 state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide 31

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1 prosecutors are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I 2 of the State Constitution. 2. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 3 security numbers, and photographs of current or former human 4 5 resource, labor relations, or employee relations directors, 6 assistant directors, managers, or assistant managers of any 7 local government agency or water management district whose 8 duties include hiring and firing employees, labor contract negotiation, administration, or other personnel-related 9 duties; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social 10 security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the 11 12 spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and 13 locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 14 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, if the subject 15 16 current or former employee provides a written statement that 17 he or she has made reasonable efforts to protect such 18 information from being accessible through other means available to the public. This subparagraph is subject to the 19 Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 20 21 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed 22 and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 23 3. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former United 2.4 States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; the 25 26 home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 27 photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and 2.8 children of current or former United States attorneys and 29 assistant United States attorneys; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of 30 current or former United States attorneys and assistant United 31

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States attorneys are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

7 4. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 8 security numbers, and photographs of current or former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district 9 judges, and United States magistrate judges; the home 10 addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 11 12 photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and 13 children of current or former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district judges, and United States 14 magistrate judges; and the names and locations of schools and 15 day care facilities attended by the children of current or 16 17 former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States 18 district judges, and United States magistrate judges are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State 19 Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open 20 21 Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and 22 shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and 23 saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 5. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 2.4 security numbers, and photographs of current or former code 25 enforcement officers; the names, home addresses, telephone 26 27 numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of

employment of the spouses and children of such persons; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such persons are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This

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subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review
Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on
October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through
reenactment by the Legislature.

5 6. The home addresses, telephone numbers, places of 6 employment, and photographs of current or former guardians ad 7 litem, as defined in s. 39.820, and the names, home addresses, 8 telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such persons, are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 9 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, if the guardian ad 10 litem provides a written statement that the guardian ad litem 11 12 has made reasonable efforts to protect such information from 13 being accessible through other means available to the public. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset 14 Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand 15 repealed on October 2, 2010, unless reviewed and saved from 16 17 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 18 7. An agency that is the custodian of the personal 19 information specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., 20 subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., subparagraph 5., or 21 subparagraph 6. and that is not the employer of the officer, 22 employee, justice, judge, or other person specified in 23 subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., subparagraph 5., or subparagraph 6. shall 2.4 maintain the exempt status of the personal information only if 25 the officer, employee, justice, judge, other person, or 26 27 employing agency of the designated employee submits a written 2.8 request for maintenance of the exemption to the custodial 29 agency. 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2006. 31
