exempt from the public records law under this section may not be disclosed publicly: (1) To another governmental entity in the furtherance of its duties and responsibilities; or (2) If the affected individual unless the affected client or elder person or his or her legal representative provides written consent. (2) This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995, in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2006.
