I of the State 94 95 Constitution for 10 years after the date an economic development 96 agency receives a request for confidentiality or until otherwise disclosed, whichever occurs first. The 10 year period of 97 98 confidentiality provided by this subsection does not apply to any portion of the records other than trade secrets as defined 99 by s. 812.081. 100

101 (5) A public officer or employee may not enter into a 102 binding agreement with any corporation, partnership, or person 103 who has requested confidentiality of information pursuant to 104 this section until 90 days after the information is made public 105 unless:
