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19	Section 1. Subsections (1), (2), and (3) of section

24	(1) Those portions of a comprehensive emergency
25	management plan which address the response of a public or
26	private hospital to an act of terrorism as defined by s.
27	775.30 and which are filed with or are in the possession of
28	the agency, a state or local law enforcement agency, a county
29	or municipal emergency management agency, the Executive Office
30	of the Governor, the Department of Health, or the Department
31	of Community Affairs are confidential and exempt from the

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(3) Any portion of a public meeting which would reveal information contained in a comprehensive emergency management plan which addresses the response of a hospital to an act of terrorism is exempt from the provisions of s. 286.011 and s. 24(b), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subsection is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2006.

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********* SENATE SUMMARY Removes the repeal under the Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemptions from public-records requirements provided for emergency management plans that address a hospital's response to terrorism and an exemption from public-meetings requirements provided for portions of a public meeting which would reveal such an emergency management plan.
